Discuss and Consider Ordinance 173-O-072: Modify The 2018 Sheriff's Department Budget To Appropriate Expenditures For Personnel And Increase Interdepartmental Revenue And Charges For Services Revenue

Johnson and Joost were present to discuss this ordinance which modifies the 2018 Sheriff's Department budget by appropriating personnel expenditures of \$114,000 for overtime due to greater than anticipated demand for department services. The ordinance increases the budget for interdepartmental revenues by \$53,000 due to a services provided to the Health and Human Services Department. This ordinance also increases the charges for service budget by \$61,000 due to higher reimbursable overtime utilized for patrol contracts (\$48,000) and federal inmate transportation and security services (\$13,000) billed to the Marshal's Office. This ordinance results in no additional tax levy impact.

MOTION: Wood moved, second by Dondlinger to approve Ordinance 173-O-072. Motion carried 7-0.

Presentation on Criminal Justice Collaborating Council (CJCC) Treatment Courts and Evidence Based Decision Making Workgroups

Luczaj gave the committee two handouts: one of the amended bylaws of the CJCC and one on treatment court statistics. She went on to explain the evidence-based decision making initiative that the County underwent and the new standing committees of the Council.
