# **Update on Miller Park District**

Duckett and Kreklow were present to discuss this item. Duckett covered the history of the board and issues relating to ending the Miller Park .10% sales tax implemented in 1997. The Miller Park District Board of Directors intends to officially certify the end of the tax during its March 2020 meeting. March certification includes that adequate funds are placed in escrow through the initial lease of 2030 and potential lease extensions through 2040. Funds returned to the county must be used for specific purposes such as public safety, parks and recreation, and related categories. There are \$21 million in contingency funds to protect the district in future years.
