FIRST EDITION OF THE BUSINESS GROWTH STRATEGY

2016-2018 RECAP


The first Business Growth Strategy for Waukesha County was developed around two core objectives: to develop a central point of contact for businesses looking for workforce, financial and site selection assistance and to develop an organized strategy to connect businesses with organizations that have the resources to provide the assistance.

With the help of 40 stakeholders and partners, four strategic outcomes were created to serve as the foundation of the strategy.

- 1. A central point of contact for businesses looking to expand in or relocate to Waukesha County.
- 2. A business outreach strategy to identify the needs of businesses seeking to expand in or relocate to Waukesha County.
- 3. A strategy to identify Waukesha County business workforce needs and connect to available workforce development resources.
- 4. A strategy to develop a collaborative fund to increase financial tools to businesses in Waukesha County and sustain the Economic Development Organization.

As a result of the Business Growth Strategy, the Waukesha County Center for Growth was created in 2016 in partnership with the Waukesha County, City of Waukesha, Waukesha County Business Alliance, the Wisconsin Small Business Development Center and local municipalities, with the mission to connect businesses with the resources they need to grow in Waukesha County. Over the last three years the organization has established a 16-member board of directors to strengthen partnerships which have a significant impact on advancing businesses and growing Waukesha County.

SECOND EDITION OF THE BUSINESS GROWTH STRATEGY

2019-2021

The second edition of the Business Growth Strategy for Waukesha County will serve as a guide for the Waukesha County Center for Growth board and staff for the next three years. Operational plans and tactical strategies will be created to support outcomes, key performance indicators and timelines. This will ensure the collective efforts of the organization and its partners are aligned around common goals.

Through the analysis of demographic, economic and labor market information, input from the Advisory Council and benchmark research, four strategic outcomes and three key initiatives have been identified as critical to the success of the Waukesha County Center for Growth and Waukesha County businesses.

Key performance indicators have been developed for each strategic outcome. These will help the Waukesha County Center for Growth board and staff monitor progress and, if needed, make adjustments to strategies. Annual targets will be set for each key performance indicator by the Waukesha County Center for Growth board. The key performance indicators, targets and results will be displayed in a quarterly dashboard format with overall results being shared publicly through the Waukesha County Center for Growth's annual reports.

Planning overview and process


A four-month planning process that involved a multi-stakeholder Advisory Council was kicked-off in February 2019. Extensive data and research were compiled by the University of Wisconsin – Extension and the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission. The Advisory Council reviewed the data and research, refined the strategic outcomes, and provided valuable input on operationalizing the outcomes over the next three years. This information was used to create the 2nd Edition of the Business Growth Strategy for Waukesha County for 2019 – 2021. The Waukesha County Center for Growth Board of Directors reviewed and approved this three-year strategy on May 10, 2019.

Who are the key partners?

As the central point of contact for businesses, the Waukesha County Center for Growth collaborates with several organizations to maximize results and leverage the expertise of partners. These relationships are vital to achieving the strategic outcomes and objectives, and delivering best-in-class service to Waukesha County businesses.













EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT







OTHER STRATEGIC INITIATIVES

Three overarching topics – education, housing, and transportation – were brought up on numerous occasions during the planning of the Business Growth Strategy. While there are no direct outcomes or key performance indicators on these topics, the Waukesha County Center for Growth recognizes that these broad issues affect the economic health and competitiveness of Waukesha County. Waukesha County Center for Growth staff and board members are committed to working with our regional partners to play an active role in helping to address these issues.

Education

Waukesha County is leading the charge in addressing the workforce issue by creating new programs and expanding existing ones to address workforce needs in Waukesha County's four high-growth industries: manufacturing, health care, construction/skilled trades and information technology. Ongoing efforts include student tours, career expos, and parent and educator conversations which are offered in partnership with Waukesha County school districts and businesses.



Housing

To proactively meet the needs of employers looking to attract and retain their workforce, Waukesha County is engaging partners to explore lifecycle housing opportunities. The Waukesha County Center for Growth continues to play an active role in these discussions on behalf of businesses and municipal partners.

Transportation

The Waukesha County Center for Growth will continue to support the business community's need to find flexible solutions to workforce transportation. Ongoing efforts include assisting businesses with grant and funding opportunities, facilitating connections to existing transportation resources, and playing an active role in community conversations.
