

Fifty-one Waukesha County youth, parents and Collegiate 4-H students participated with James Boling and Jerry Braatz at the UW-Madison Science Festival on Saturday, October 15.

Youth engaged in demonstrations, hands-on science exhibitions and workshops in the Geology Museum, the Physics Museum, the Discovery Building and the Biotechnology Center. The Science Festival provided youth with the opportunity to explore interactive, hands-on exploration stations that feature STEM activities ranging from virtual reality to health and medicine, physics, engineering, animal science, chemistry and DNA Activities. Collegiate 4-H members discussed their university experience with older youth.

Around the Table Encourages Mindfulness and Healthy Behaviors in Teens

In August, FoodWise taught an *Around the Table* series to teenagers as part of Waukesha County Health and Human Services Positive Youth Initiatives.



Around the Table uses mindfulness to build teens' cooking skills and support healthy

connections to food. Mindful activities such as "soup bowl breathing" helped teens to be present and engaged. Participants made roasted carrots, celery with hummus, egg and vegetable burritos, mango salsa, fruit salad, pico de gallo, and taco soup. The group also ate together and discussed nutrition topics. Participants reported favorite recipes and improved confidence in making and eating healthy foods.
