# UNAPPROVED MINUTES

## ANNUAL MEETING SEPTEMBER 22, 2021

### UNAPPROVED

#### Call to Order:

Meeting called to order at 7:07 PM by Chairman Joe Graczyk.

#### Open Meeting Notice:

The meeting was noticed and posted according to law.

#### Approval of Minutes from September 26, 2020 Annual Meeting:

**Mary Heuver motioned to approve the meeting minutes from 9-26-2020, seconded by Kathy Verduyn. Motion carried (unanimous).**

#### Fisheries Management/Stocking:

Steve Verduyn provided an update. The permit was approved by the DNR. 1300 Walleye and 1800 Bass will be stocked on 9-29-2021 at approximately 10am. The stockings will be split with half going in at the Andrews St launch and half going in at the Police access point off Shady Ln.

Jack Fiene had concerns with Walleye being stocked on Lower Phantom lake due to the shallow nature of the lake and higher water temperatures. Dave Schmalzer said that he has successfully caught Walleye on upper and lower phantom lakes and stocking has been successful in addition to keeping the pan fish population in check.

#### Harvesting Report:

Harvesting Manager, Dawn Couillard, provided an update. There was a slow start to the season this year due to engine problems with the harvester and weather delays preventing the launch. Low water levels also made harvesting difficult at times. The harvesting crew/employees have been working out well. The dump truck is in good shape, although the harvester is rough shape and has a leaking hydraulic pump and a leaking hydraulic motor for one of the cutters. PLMD will investigate having these issues resolved during the off season. The harvester is scheduled to be removed 10-6-2021.

Bill Morris is a contractor with a special (smaller) 5ft harvester and was hired by PLMD. Bill was on the lake 3 times during the 2021 season, for approximately 7 days total. His crew removed aquatic plants in the shallow water areas specified in the DNR harvesting permit that only permit a smaller machine. PLMD plans to continue this for the 2022 season.

Jack Fiene commented that Mike Eastlund cannot get his boat out from his shoreline. Jake Jagmin responded indicating PLMD is not permitted to harvest in that area currently and the DNR will not revise the harvesting permit until it expires in 2024 and a plant survey is completed.

#### Lake Plant Survey (as required by Wi DNR):

Joanne Tlachac-Hehn presented the current harvesting map as permitted by the DNR and advised that it expires on 12-31-2023. There are requirements that must be satisfied in order to renew and/or modify the harvesting permit, including having a plant survey performed.

PLMD intends to hire a contractor or company, an expert in this field, to perform this survey and interact with the DNR on behalf of PLMD to help obtain PLMD's harvesting goals.

PLMD can apply for a grant to cover some of the costs involved with having the plant survey performed.

**Joanne Tlachac-Hehn motions to accept the resolution to process the lake plant survey grant application. Jack Fiene seconded. Motion carried (unanimous).**

#### New 7' Harvester Acquisition:

Adam Miller said PLMD received an DNR grant to cover 43% of the purchase price of a new harvester. Darlene Johnson thanked Adam Miller for completing the grant process on PLMD's behalf.

Jake Jagmin brought up lead-times on some replacement parts for the current 10' harvester, such as the main hydraulic pumps that are leaking are up to 14 weeks and recommends PLMD operates two harvesters.

**Joe Graczyk motioned to purchase a new 7' harvester from Inland Lake Harvesters in the amount not to exceed \$167,002 including the grant funds. Jack Fiene seconded. Motion carried (unanimous).**

#### Items from the Floor:

Jack Fiene and Christine Pawlak had concerns that the sanctioned boat races are spreading aquatic plants on lower Phantom, are excessively loud and are harmful to wildlife and the lake in general. Dave Dubey said that the Town of Mukwonago permits the races and not PLMD.

Jack Fiene also had concerns that some buoys were too small. Adam Miller responded that the buoys placed by the Town for navigation purposes are 36".

Dave Johnson questioned if Lake Patrol is utilizing DNR grants for funding. Dave Dubey said he believes they are, and the Town Police Dept applies for these grants.

#### Treasurer's/Secretary's Assistant Open position:

Colleen Mutchler submitted her resume and cover letter PLMD. She was the sole applicant to fill this vacant role.

**Jake Jagmin motioned to hire Colleen Mutchler as a contractor to assist PLMD with treasurer and secretary duties at a rate of \$20/hr effective immediately. Adam Miller seconded. Motion carried (unanimous).**

#### Approval of 2021 Audit Report:

Item is tabled due to the 2021 audit report not yet being available.

#### Adoption of 2022 Proposed Budget:

Steve Verduyn had concerns that the levy was being increased while funds were available in the GOF account. If these funds are intended to be used for equipment purchases, they should be allocated into the equipment reserve fund.

**Jake Jagmin motioned to approve the budget as presented with an additional \$10,000 being transferred from GOF to equipment reserves resulting in the following modifications:**

**Line 71 updated to \$32,000**

**Line 67 updated to \$22,155 (Continued on page 5)**

**Line 62 updated to \$32,000**

**Steve Verduyn seconded. Motion carried (unanimous).**

**Approval of Resolution 2021-01: Levy for 2022:**

**Dave Schmalzer motioned to approve the levy at \$132,902 (line 15 of the budget) for calendar year 2022. Tim Rutenbeck seconded. Motion carried (unanimous).**

**Election of Commissioners for 2021-2024:**

There are two open seats. Joe Graczyk and Joanne Tlachac-Hehn placed their names on the ballots.

33 ballots were cast with 33 votes for Joe Graczyk, 33 votes for Joanne Tlachac-Hehn and zero write ins. PLMD welcomes Joe Graczyk and Joanne Tlachac-Hehn to serve on the PLMD board for the appointed 3-year terms.

**Set 2022 Annual Meeting Date:**

**Jake Jagmin motioned to have the PLMD annual meeting on Wednesday, September 28, 2022, at 7:00PM. Seconded by Joe Graczyk. Motion carried (unanimous).**

**Adjournment:**

**Jake Jagmin made a motion to adjourn at 8:59PM. Joe Graczyk seconded. Motion carried (unanimous).**

## New ILH-450 Harvester

After applying and receiving a grant awarded by Wisconsin Waterways Commission our new harvester is here. Residents, board members and friends inspected and test drove PLMD's new 7ft ILH450 harvester from Inland Lake Harvesters during the 7/19/2022 commissioning ceremony. The new machine features a 13 compartment stainless steel hull, customizable dual proportional joystick control, 7" HMI Touch screen with digital instrumentation for fuel, rpm, hydraulic oil temp and pressure, engine oil, engine hours, operational hours, cutting hours, harvesting maps and more. The ergonomic seat rotates 180 degrees with the flip of a lever that simultaneously and automatically reverses the joystick with respect to the new operator position. Real time load balance instrumentation is incorporated for safety. The hydraulic wash down pump for cleaning debris can be operated via digital or manual controls.

This unit will be sharing the lake with our 1994 ILH-800.

Due to an increase in the amount of the DNR grant funds received the acquisition of the new ILC-450 came in under budget.

## FISHING THE PHANTOMS

Fishing pressure continues to be high on the lakes. Panfishing remains consistent, but you'll need to sort through a lot of small ones. Early and late in the day are best. The weekly bass tournament is again being run out of Castaways this year. So far this year, both numbers of bass coming in and overall size is up from last year. The fish are very healthy looking this year. So far, three bass over 20" have come in, with several more over 19". All fish caught and brought in for the Wednesday night tournament are released back into the lake alive immediately after they are measured for the contest. The Phantom Lakes Management District will continue its fish stocking efforts this fall. As of right now, the PLMD hasn't yet determined which species will be stocked. Keep an eye on the PLMD website ([www.phantomlakes.us](http://www.phantomlakes.us)) for updates on stocking. A special "THANK YOU" goes out to the private donations made to the PLMD for fish stocking. Contact any PLMD Board member if you'd interested in making a donation. 100% of donations made for fish stocking are spent on fish stocking only. Please consider catch and release, especially for any gamefish you may catch. Larger sized gamefish are critical to keeping panfish populations in check. Our lakes get a lot of fishing pressure, so releasing gamefish is especially helpful on lakes like ours. Reminder: the legal-size limit is now 18" for walleye, and the possession limit is three (3). Bass must be 14" to keep.

## Lake News

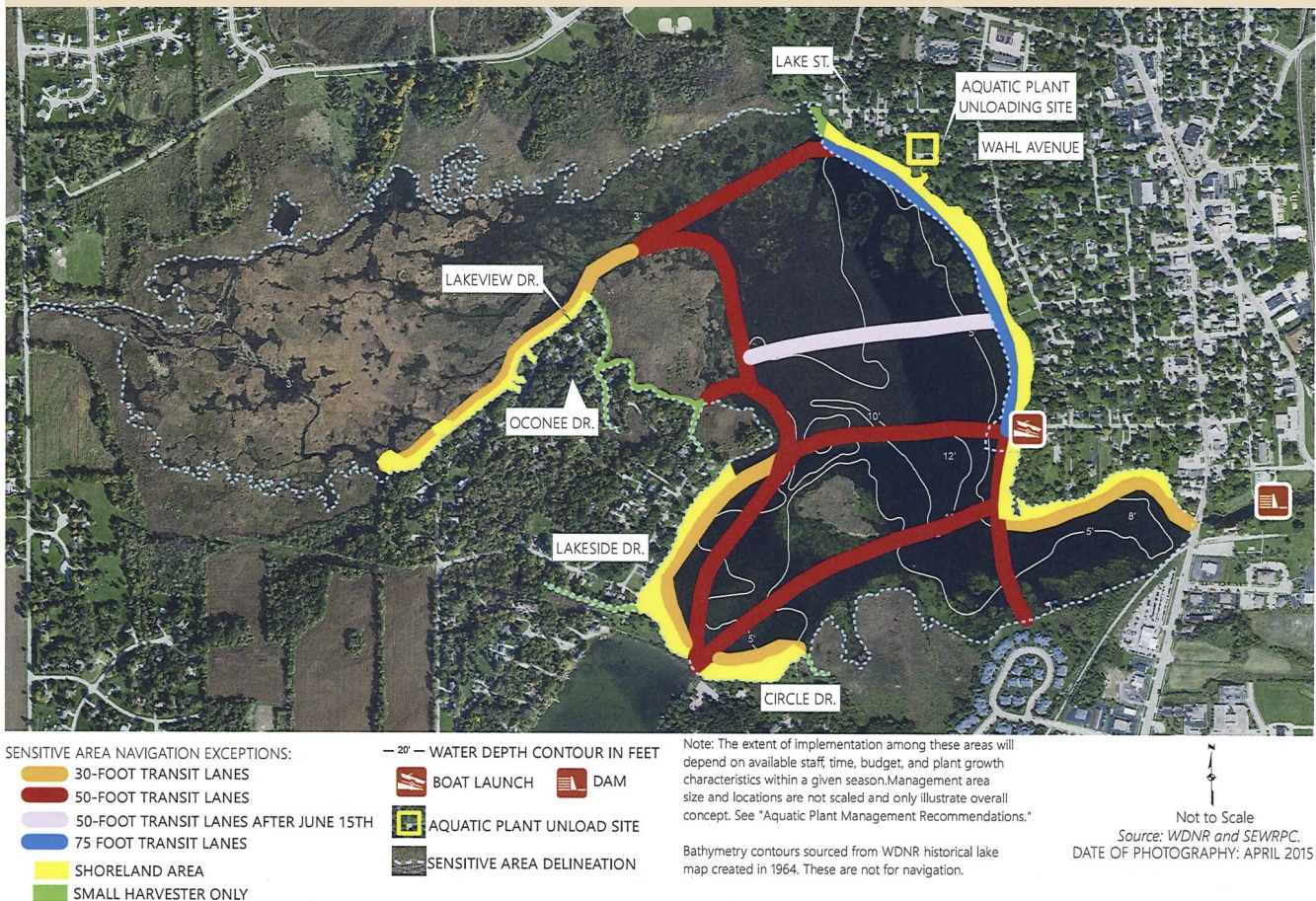
Many repairs to our 10ft 1994 harvester have been an issue this year, downtime and supply chain issues have made scheduling very difficult. Repairs to the conveyer, conveyor clips, belting and knife blade and grease line have been completed this year. Seeking a consensus on what to do with the 1994 10ft harvester (sell/replace, continue to maintain, backup).

Low water levels and high winds disrupted our harvesting schedule and efficiency this year leaving the operators in a constant state of catch up. We have posted maps of our cutting permit lanes at both the Town and Village launches so boaters can avoid the cutting lanes when the harvesters are out.

In late August you may have seen a boat performing a point intercept survey. This survey was performed at over 700 points on our lakes to better understand the species we host and prepare for our next harvesting permit with the DNR. This has been an ongoing effort; we did not receive funds from the grant we applied for last season.

The Natural Resource Board is ruling on legislature for NR107 and NR109 that would affect the cost of yearly permits and licenses to harvest our lakes. This legislature would increase the permit price to \$2,500 for PLMD's mechanical harvesting application and then \$1,750 for the remaining four years of the permit. The current fee is \$300 for the application and then \$150 for the remaining four years of the permit. These fees have not been changed since 2003.

## PROPOSED 2023 CANADA GOOSE ROUND-UP

- Canadian Geese provide some aesthetic and recreational value but also contribute to nuisance and human health and safety concerns.
- **Did you know?** Each goose leaves behind a pound of feces per day which results in fouled property, sanitary concerns, increased algae blooms, and higher E. coli levels at beaches.
- To mitigate this issue, the DNR promotes strict usage of USDA Wildlife Services, to conduct “round-ups” of geese. USDA Wildlife Services has an endorsed, sustainable method of capturing these geese and donating them ALL as animal food, at a current fee of \$3,500. This cost has been budgeted within the (unapproved) 2023 PLMD budget.
- Note: Round-ups are only permitted between June 15<sup>th</sup> and July 4<sup>th</sup>. Geese are captured by herding onto land, surrounding with netted panels, and transferring them into ventilated poultry crates on a trailer. Volunteers in boats may be needed to persuade the animals to land.
- DNR does not allow the birds to relocate; all birds are humanely euthanized and donated as either human or animal food.
- Goose round-ups generally remove the primary breeding birds from a site thereby maintaining lower populations for several years following a round-up.

Phantom Lakes Management district is investigating coordinating a 2023 goose round-up, with assistance from the USDA. The decision to move forward with a 2023 round-up will be made during the 9/28/2022 annual meeting, based on feedback from residents.

Although the round-up is currently unapproved, PLMD has provided the private property permissions form now to avoid additional costs associated with mailing additional flyers to residents, should the round-up be approved.

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### **Permission form allowing USDA-Wildlife Services access to private property.**

I authorize representatives from the United States Department of Agriculture - Wildlife Services to access the property listed below for the purposes of goose management (egg oiling and/or round-up). This permission form has no expiration date and remains in effect unless you request to be removed from the approved site list. Decisions on goose management will be made on an annual basis. Please notify PLMD if you wish to be removed from the list, have problems with geese on your property, know of a nest, or have any questions or concerns. Thank you for your assistance.

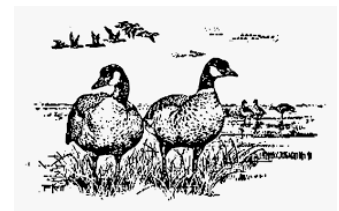
