This ordinance authorizes the Waukesha County Department of Parks and Land Use to accept donations totaling \$30,000 from the Friends of Retzer Nature Center and to appropriate \$30,000 of operating expenses for improvements to the Citizen Science Learning Lab at the Retzer Nature Center. This ordinance allows for the first phase of the effort to enhance the Citizen Science Learning Lab to begin in 2023. The donations will be used to fund items such as mobile workstations, a movable demonstration cart, extra chairs and a chair storage cart.

An additional \$20,000 worth of expenses funded with donations to continue this effort will be included the Departments 2024 budget request.

Annually by August 1, the Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin will provide the County with Project information regarding stocking totals, dates, project costs and specific locations for Okauchee Lake, Pewaukee Lake, Oconomowoc and Fox River system watersheds muskellunge stocking for purposes of completing the following year application for County Conservation Grants.
- b. Agree that grant funds received pursuant to this Agreement shall be solely devoted to the Project. The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin hereby shall complete the Project in the calendar year 2024 and shall obtain any required permits from the WDNR and all other applicable permits required for the Project.
- c. Manage the muskellunge stocking assuring compliance with all WDNR grant requirements and will assume all future maintenance of the Project.
- d. Provide timely payment for all required matching funds toward the Project that the County becomes obligated to contribute toward the Project pursuant to Wisconsin Statute Section 23.09(12)(c). The County shall have no financial obligation whatsoever toward the Project.
- e. Submit to the County all reimbursement requests and information, via email, within one month of project completion including:
 - i. Cancelled checks for all reimbursable project costs
 - ii. Receipts to accompany cancelled checks for all reimbursable costs
 - iii. Fish health certification
 - iv. Permits
 - v. All other project documents requested or relevant
- 3) The County shall:
 - a. Annually by Oct. 1, upon receipt of all necessary and required information from The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin, County will apply to the State of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources ("WDNR") for a County Conservation Grant for financial aid for the Project.
 - b. Notify The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin of the financial aid amount if and when a grant is approved by WDNR.
 - c. Process Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin reimbursement requests within 6 months of project completion and receipt of required information from the Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin.
 - d. Submit reimbursement request to the WDNR using grant form 8700-001.
- 4) Throughout the term of this Agreement, The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin shall carry liability insurance for claims which may occur in carrying out this Agreement, name the County as additional insured on the insurance policies, and provide the County with a certificate of insurance evidencing the required insurance.
- 5) County shall not be held liable for and The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin hereby releases, waives and discharges County, its boards, commissions, officers, agents, and employees from any and all liability to The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin for any and all loss, injury or damage, and any claim for damages resulting therefrom, whether known or unknown, past, present or future, on account of any injury, loss, or damage to property suffered by The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin, their agents, employees, volunteers, contractors or any third-party, whether caused by the act, error, or omission of the County, arising from or in any way related to performance under the terms of this Agreement. The Muskellunge Club of Wisconsin agree to agrees to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the County, its boards, commissions, officers, agents, and employees from any and all liability including claims, demands, damages, actions or causes of action together with any and all losses, costs, or expenses, including attorney

EXISTING USE(S):

Single family residence with an attached garage and three accessory buildings, one of which may be used to store commercial vehicles and equipment. A small amount of acreage is also farmed, and approximately 55 acres is wooded and/or undeveloped.

REQUESTED USE:

Rezone a portion of the property in order to divide a 1.2 acre parcel for a family member to construct a new single family residence.

EXISTING ZONING DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION(S):

FLP Farmland Preservation District under the Waukesha County Zoning Code which requires a minimum lot size of 35 acres.

PROPOSED ZONING DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION(S):

R-1 Residential District which requires a minimum lot size of one acre and a minimum average width of 150 feet.

SOIL TYPES:

The proposed land division contains soils that are well drained and are prime agricultural soils of statewide significance.

CONFORMANCE WITH THE WAUKESHA COUNTY COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (WCCDP) AND THE TOWN OF OTTAWA COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (CDP):

The Town CDP designates the land to be divided as Prime Agricultural (35+ acres/dwelling unit). The County's CDP is similar, except the ag category is Farmland Preservation. The proposed zoning change complies with both the Town and County CDP's as the FLP District allows for rezoning of parcels between one and three acres in size (minimum average width of 150 feet) to the R-1 category.

PUBLIC HEARING DATE:

August 7, 2023

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Three persons spoke in favor of the request. The petitioner noted no one wants to farm this area of his property anymore as it is too small.

TOWN PLAN COMMISSION ACTION:

On August 7, 2023, the Town of Ottawa Plan Commission unanimously recommended approval of the zoning amendment request to the Waukesha County Park and Planning Commission subject to the Town Planner's report and recommendation.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The parent parcel is located on the north side of Hardscrabble Road (66' ROW), approximately 2,850 feet east of the county line and where CTH Z turns to the south (refer to Exhibit A). The parent parcel contains wetland, floodplain, ditches and streams, PEC, hydric and prime ag soils as well as soils of statewide significance.

In order to divide the 1.2 acre lot from the parent parcel as proposed (refer to rezone map), the rezone request is required in accordance with the County Zoning Code-FLP District. If the proposed zoning change is approved, the new parcel would be approximately 160 feet in width and used for single family residential purposes. The proposed parcel is located adjacent to Hardscrabble Road where other residences are clustered on small acreage, and on lands that are no longer cultivated, all of which complies with the siting standards for new residences on new lots as outlined in the FLP District. The remnant parcel would be 75.2 acres in size and contain the existing single family residence, attached garage, and three accessory buildings.

Since this is a farmland preservation zoned parcel, density credits are tracked. This parcel has one credit remaining and if the rezone is approved and the land division is recorded, no density credits will remain. The proposed land division will require a Driveway and Access Agreement to be drafted and reviewed and approved by the Town Planner and the Waukesha County Planning and Zoning Division as part of the CSM review process. The Town of Ottawa and the County Park and Planning Commission will also need to consider a lot not abutting a public road (flag lot) and a remnant parcel waiver as part of the CSM review process.

The larger parcel is surrounded by PEC to the west, north, and northeast, FLC and FLP to the southwest, Other Open Lands to be Preserved and PEC to the east, and Rural Density and Other Agricultural Land (County)/Agricultural 10 Acre Density (Town) to the southeast. The adjacent zoning districts are C-1 Overlay (DFA to the north and east; wetlands to west, north and east); EC Overlay to the west, north and east; HG High Groundwater to the west, north and east; FLC and FLP to the southwest; AD-10 to the east.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Based on the above analysis, the Planning and Zoning Division staff recommends <u>approval</u> of the request. The proposal is consistent with the Town and County Comprehensive Development Plans and will comply with the Waukesha County Zoning Code in that the proposed one acre plus parcel is

being rezoned to R-1 as required in the FLP District and will meet the required lot size. The next step in the process will be for the property owner to submit a formal Certified Survey Map to the Town of Ottawa and the County Planning and Zoning Division for consideration.

WHEREAS, Waukesha County has determined that financial aid is required to carry out the New Berlin Trail Rehabilitation Project; and
WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin Department of Transportation requires an ordinance authorizing the Department of Parks and Land Use to apply for and accept available grant funds for the project.
THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA ORDAINS that the Department of Parks and Land Use, through its Director or his designee, is authorized to act on behalf of Waukesha County to submit a grant application to the State of Wisconsin Department of Transportation's Federal Transportation Alternative Grant Program for any financial aid that may be available.
BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that the Director of the Department of Parks and Land Use, or his designee, is authorized to execute a grant agreement, in a form to be approved by Corporation Counsel, accept awarded state grant funds, submit reimbursement claims to the State, and take all necessary actions to complete the New Berlin Trail Rehabilitation Project.

The project was updated to include \$787,000 for the rehabilitation of 1.0 mile of pavement on the New Berlin Trail. TAP grant revenue is anticipated to cover 80% of the increased cost. The department intends to apply for Stewardship Program funding from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to cover the remaining costs of the pavement rehabilitation.

Shoreland and Floodland zoning citation schedule modifications (RZ 129, 130)

On August 22, 2023, the County Board approved the creation of the Waukesha County Floodland Protection Ordinance as a stand alone floodplain zoning ordinance. On the same night, the board also approved changes to the Waukesha County Shoreland & Floodland Protection Ordinance (SFPO) to remove floodplain zoning ordinance provisions from that ordinance and to re-title it as the Waukesha County Shoreland Protection Ordinance. Because of these actions, the existing Waukesha County Shoreland & Floodland Protection Ordinance violation forfeiture schedule needs to be amended and a citation schedule created for the Floodland Protection Ordinance.

The existing SFPO forfeiture schedule is proposed to be modified to eliminate floodplain related zoning matters, reflect ordinance section re-numbering and to update the name of the ordinance consistent with the recent amendments. The proposed changes to the schedule are shown in strike thru and underlined text in the attached Exhibit A. The proposed citation schedule for the Floodland Protection Ordinance includes forfeiture amounts for specific floodplain zoning matters. The base forfeiture amounts for each floodplain zoning offense is set at \$50 consistent with state limitations for such matters.

Forfeiture schedules are referenced in both respective corresponding ordinances. This action will keep the schedules in sync with the recently approved ordinances. Because the board's approval of the two zoning ordinances referenced was conditioned with an effective date of October 19, 2023, these citation schedules are also proposed to have an effective date of the same. The schedules are necessary for the county to be able to fulfill its obligations in enforcing state shoreland zoning and state and federal floodplain zoning standards.

Shoreland and Floodland zoning citation schedule modifications (RZ 129, 130)

On August 22, 2023, the County Board approved the creation of the Waukesha County Floodland Protection Ordinance as a stand alone floodplain zoning ordinance. On the same night, the board also approved changes to the Waukesha County Shoreland & Floodland Protection Ordinance (SFPO) to remove floodplain zoning ordinance provisions from that ordinance and to re-title it as the Waukesha County Shoreland Protection Ordinance. Because of these actions, the existing Waukesha County Shoreland & Floodland Protection Ordinance violation forfeiture schedule needs to be amended and a citation schedule created for the Floodland Protection Ordinance.

The existing SFPO forfeiture schedule is proposed to be modified to eliminate floodplain related zoning matters, reflect ordinance section re-numbering and to update the name of the ordinance consistent with the recent amendments. The proposed changes to the schedule are shown in strike thru and underlined text in the attached Exhibit A. The proposed citation schedule for the Floodland Protection Ordinance includes forfeiture amounts for specific floodplain zoning matters. The base forfeiture amounts for each floodplain zoning offense is set at \$50 consistent with state limitations for such matters.

Forfeiture schedules are referenced in both respective corresponding ordinances. This action will keep the schedules in sync with the recently approved ordinances. Because the board's approval of the two zoning ordinances referenced was conditioned with an effective date of October 19, 2023, these citation schedules are also proposed to have an effective date of the same. The schedules are necessary for the county to be able to fulfill its obligations in enforcing state shoreland zoning and state and federal floodplain zoning standards.





AMEND CHAPTER 4 OF THE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES REGARDING OPERATING PROCEDURES AND RULES RELATED TO NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS AT THE BOARD'S ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING

WHEREAS, the County Board is elected in the spring of even years; and

WHEREAS, at the first meeting after each regular election at which members are elected for full terms, the County Board elects a chairperson, vice chairperson, 2nd vice chairperson, and two atlarge executive committee members; and

WHEREAS, the County Board's executive committee consists of the county board chairperson, first vice chairperson, second vice chairperson, two members elected by the county board of supervisors and two members appointed by the county board chairperson. Each member of the executive committee chairs a standing committee of the County Board; and

 WHEREAS, in an effort to increase transparency, two sets of changes to the Organization Meeting procedures are proposed. The first is to have supervisors declare their interest in a leadership position ahead of time so the slate of candidates are known going into the meeting, to expressly allow additional nominations from the floor, and to discontinue the use of an informal/nominating ballot. The second change is to allow all candidates the option to speak at the Organizational Meeting prior to voting.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA ORDAINS that Sec. 4-64 of the County Code be amended and restated as follows:

Sec. 4-64 Organization.

(a) The county board of supervisors, at the first meeting after each regular election at which members are elected for full terms, shall elect a member chairperson, a member vice chairperson, a member 2nd vice chairperson, and two (2) at-large members of the executive committee.

 (b) County board supervisors can declare their candidacy for chairperson, vice chairperson, 2nd vice chairperson, and/or at-large member of the executive committee one week prior to the organizational meeting through procedures established by the county board office.

 (c) Candidates who have formally declared their candidacy for an open position need not be further nominated. Additional nominations may be made from the floor. Declarations of candidacy and floor nominations shall not prevent balloting for any other member.

(d) Each candidate will be given the option to speak for up to five (5) minutes prior to balloting.(a) Pollets shall be east for chairmerson, viae absirmerson and 2nd viae absirmerson.

 (e) Ballots shall be cast for chairperson, vice chairperson and 2nd vice chairperson separately, shall be by secret ballot, and shall be cast until a member receives the vote of the majority of the members present. The same procedure shall be used for the election of two at-large members of the executive committee except that such ballots shall not be secret.

(f) For the protection of the minority, it is not permissible to suspend this section by any procedure.

1 MODIFY THE 2023 WAUKESHA COUNTY BUDGET 2 AND APPROVE MODIFICATIONS TO COMPENSATION AND BENEFIT STRUCTURES 3 FOR NON-REPRESENTED EMPLOYEES 4 5 WHEREAS, the Waukesha County total compensation system is reviewed and updated to stay in 6 alignment with the competitive labor market and the County's compensation philosophy; and 7 8 WHEREAS, Waukesha County has historically engaged in a process to validate and adjust the 9 compensation policy as necessary to ensure market competitiveness through the periodic 10 engagement (5-year cycle) of outside compensation analysts; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the County 2023 budget approved and funded a compensation consultant to conduct 13 a total compensation market study and to make recommendations on salary structures, benefits, 14 and the pay-for-performance system; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the total compensation philosophy is to remain competitive with both the public and private sector labor markets to enable the County to recruit, hire and retain highly qualified and 17 experienced employees; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, modifications to the compensation and benefit structures will contribute to the 21 County's long-term strategic and fiscal objectives; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the consultant concluded that the County's total compensation lags behind the 24 private sector overall and lags behind the public sector in certain areas; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the study conclusions lead to recommendations to adjust the pay range assignments 27 for seventy (70) classifications, modify the base performance award system to be aligned more 28 closely with the private sector, modify the base and non-base award eligibility for effective level performance, modify the non-base award for employees at range maximum, modify the vacation 29 benefit for newly-hired exempt and non-exempt employees, modify the vacation exception 30 policy, modify the provision of holiday and floating holidays, modify the maximum amount of 31 compensatory time accrued, modify the insurance effective dates for new hires, and provide 32 33 competency based merit increases for Telecommunicators; and 34 35 WHEREAS, surveys of local hospital systems indicate that the industry standard is to provide a 36 shift premium differential for psychiatric technicians working in psychiatric hospitals/units, 37 which the County does not provide for its psychiatric technicians; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the County provides a shift premium differential to the registered nurses who work 40 at the mental health center, and providing a shift premium for psychiatric technicians would bring alignment with the two classifications working with the same population, and aid in 41 42 County recruitment and retention efforts; and 43 44 WHEREAS, the County has the flexibility to hire experienced staff above the minimum of the 45 salary range for all classifications, but has limited authority to grant accelerated vacation benefits upon hire for experienced individuals, currently limited to those individuals in law enforcement, 46 47 corrections and telecommunications; and 48

- WHEREAS, it would be beneficial in recruitment and retention efforts to expand the successful policy to all county classifications and permit the acceleration of vacation benefits for newly hired experienced staff; and
- WHEREAS, the County will provide for the 2023 fiscal impact of this ordinance through a combination of affected departmental base budget resources and the appropriation of American Rescue Plan Act Plan revenues when needed; and

- WHEREAS, each year the county makes comprehensive salary range adjustments for all non-represented, seasonal, and temporary salary ranges to continue efforts to remain competitive, and this ordinance includes a salary range adjustment of three percent (3.0%) for the 2024 budget year; and
- WHEREAS, the County will provide for the 2024 fiscal impact of this ordinance in the County Executive's proposed budget for 2024.
- THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA ORDAINS that the following modifications to the compensation structure and policies be adopted, effective October 21, 2023:
 - I. Modify the Base Performance Award policy by increasing the maximum performance award levels by one percentage (1%) point.
 - II. Modify the Non-Base Performance Award policy by increasing the maximum performance award level by one percentage (1%) point for employees at the maximum of the range.
- III. Modify the Base and Non-Base Performance Award policy to allow Effective performance rated employees to be eligible for Base and Non-Base Performance Awards.
- IV. Modify the performance award policy to provide competency-based merit increases for Telecommunicators during a training period until full competency has been attained.
- V. Modify the job classification range assignments as set forth below.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED effective January 1, 2024, the insurance effective dates for health, dental, vision, flexible spending account (FSA), and supplemental benefit insurances be effective the first of the month following the date of hire for newly hired non-represented and represented employees.

Newly hired non-represented non-exempt regular part-time employees will receive up to forty (40) hours of vacation prorated in their first calendar year and, on January 1st of their second calendar year, will receive forty (40) hours of vacation.
- II. Newly hired non-represented exempt regular full-time employees will receive up to fifteen (15) days of vacation prorated in their first calendar year and, on January 1st of their second calendar year, will receive fifteen (15) days of vacation. Newly hired non-represented exempt regular part-time employees will receive up to sixty (60) hours of vacation prorated in their first calendar year and, on January 1st of their second calendar year, will receive sixty (60) hours of vacation.

FISCAL NOTE

MODIFY THE 2023 WAUKESHA COUNTY BUDGET AND APPROVE MODIFICATIONS TO COMPENSATION AND BENEFIT STRUCTURES FOR NON-REPRESENTED EMPLOYEES

This ordinance implements multiple changes necessary to maintain market competitiveness identified in the County's 2023 Compensation Study. The financial analysis of the proposed changes is based on a projection comparing the County's current compensations structure with the one proposed in this ordinance. Please note that the projection below excludes the compensation study impacts from the salary range assignment change for Telecommunicators that was already approved by the County in July (enrolled ordinance 178-34). A summary roll-up of all changes is provided at the end for the following items:

Modify job classification range assignments

The changes to the salary structure will be effective October 21, 2023. The estimated cost to the County is as follows:

The estimated cost of these salary structure changes was conservatively calculated by projecting the impact to existing staff and assuming current vacant positions are filled. Employees in the open ranges will receive a 1% pay increase for each pay grade increase. If this results in a salary lower than the minimum of the new range, the employee will instead be placed at that minimum. Employees in step ranges will be placed in the closest step in their new range that is not less than their current pay plus 1% for every pay grade increase.

Modify performance award system

The changes to the performance award system will be effective for 2023 performance evaluations and utilized in 2024 performance awards.

Performance evaluation and award instructions to supervisors will be revised to reflect availability of larger base awards, consisting of an increase in the maximum award for employees below the mid-point from 2% to 3% and for employees above the mid-point from 1% to 2%. This policy

change will give supervisors the flexibility to utilize more of the scale to communicate performance levels to employees while moving employees through pay ranges to reflect market value. The additional costs of higher base building performance pay is estimated at \$410,000 and has been factored into 2024 personnel budgets. The maximum non-base award for employees at the top of the range increases from 4% to 5% to allow for reasonable performance-based compensation, in recognition that these employees can no longer progress further into their pay range. This is expected to affect relatively few employees.

Provide new hires benefits upon the start of employment

This ordinance provides access to health, dental, vision, flexible spending account (FSA), and supplemental benefit insurances on the 1st day of the month following date of hire effective January 1, 2024. The estimated cost of providing earlier access to benefits is approximately \$120,000 annually, which is expected to be offset by vacancy and turnover savings resulting from newer employees generally earning less than the previous incumbent and the time the position is vacant between resignation and filling the position. This proposed change and resulting estimate includes both non-represented and unionized employees.

Provide one additional holiday and one additional floating holiday

The proposed changes of providing one additional holiday for Martin Luther King Day starting January of 2024 and one additional floating holiday effective February 1, 2024 for employees will impact 24/7 operations with minimum staffing requirements through increased overtime costs. The estimated cost of this change is approximately \$224,000 annually. This proposed change and resulting estimate excludes unionized employees.

The proposed changes to the vacation accrual rate for employees in their first and second year of employment will impact 24/7 operations with minimum staffing requirements through increased overtime costs. The effective date of this change is October 1, 2023 with an estimated annual cost of \$56,000 for this benefit modification. This proposed change and resulting estimate excludes unionized employees.

Create shift premiums for Psychiatric Technicians

This ordinance provides the same shift premiums for the Psychiatric Technicians that are paid to Registered Nurses working at the Mental Health Center. The effective date for these shift premiums is October 21, 2023 with an estimated additional annual cost of approximately \$40,000. Department management anticipates being able to absorb this cost within their 2023 budget, and it has been built into the 2024 budget.

Adjust the salary range for non-represented, seasonal and temporary positions

This ordinance authorizes a 3% across-the-board (ATB) wage increase for all non-represented 2023 salary ranges effective December 30, 2023. This includes all employees except elected officials and those represented by a collective bargaining agreement. The ATB was factored into initial 2024 budget assumptions and target setting and was absorbed by departments through the normal budgeting process. The fiscal impact of these changes is illustrated below:

Modify 2023 Non-Departmental budget for fiscal impact

This ordinance modifies the 2023 Non-Departmental budget to account for the above budget costs related to changes from the compensation study that are effective in 2023. The budget modification will be accounted for in the Non-Departmental budget due to the uncertainty of which departments will require additional appropriations. There continues to be a high rate of vacancy and turnover throughout the County, which can offset the additional costs approved in this ordinance. As the year progresses, these Non-Departmental budget appropriations will only be transferred to departments if their current 2023 personnel budget is unable to absorb these increases.
