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Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program Background

- Balance of State Continuum of Care was awarded \$7.5 million to develop the Youth Homelessness
 Demonstration Program for adults aged 18-24.
- Coalitions and Counties across the state of Wisconsin could apply for funding by creating a Youth Action Group and developing a Coordinated Community Plan to end youth homelessness.
- If the coalitions/counties demonstrated a need for the funding, they could then apply for specific programs for homeless youth.

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Waukesha-Ozaukee-Washington Region

- These 3 counties decided to partner together for the YHDP program with 3 lead agencies to represent their respective county:
- · Waukesha-Hebron Housing Services
- ${}^{\textstyle \star}\, \mathbf{Ozaukee}\text{-}\, \mathbf{Family}$ Promise of Ozaukee County
- · Washington- The Youth and Family Project

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- ${}^{\circ}$ In June of 2022, the WOW Region's Coordinated Community Plan was approved.
- The WOW region then began the application process for specific programs designed to assist homeless youth ages 18-24.
- In July, the WOW was approved to implement two programs to be overseen by Hebron Housing Services:
- · Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Re-housing Program
- · Youth Systems Navigator

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Joint Youth TH/RRH Program

- Assists adults ages 18-24 who are category 1 homeless in locating temporary or permeant housing.
- Category 1 Homeless is defined as any youth:
- · Living on the streets
- In their vehicle
- ${\boldsymbol{\cdot}}$ In an emergency Shelter
- · In a hotel/motel paid for by a outside agency

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Transitional Housing

- * Assists youth in locating temporary housing (no more than 24 months) where Hebron is the leaseholder.
- The youth is required to pay a "program fee" once a month for staying in the TH unit, which won't exceed 30% of their monthly income
- During their time in a TH unit, they work with a case manager and life skills coordinator to help them become self-sufficient and independent.
- The goal is to have the youth "graduate" into the Rapid Re-housing program, which is a more permanent housing solution.

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- · Assists youth in locating permanent and stable housing where they hold their own lease agreement.
- · The youth receives rent assistance and case management for 12 months after moving into their own apartment.
- · Throughout the duration of those 12 months, the goal is for the youth to complete program with the ability to afford rent and everyday expenses on their own.

How Do Homeless Youth Get Connected to this Program?

- · Homeless youth are referred to this program through Coordinated Entry.
- · If you know of a person 18-24 experiencing homelessness in Waukesha, they can be referred to the coordinated entry system in these two ways:

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Youth Systems Navigator

- The "point person" in the county for people aged 18-24 experiencing crisis situations
- The Navigator helps individuals by referring them to appropriate resources and providing guidance so that further crisis can be avoided.
