Krueger reported that Dane County Executive budget has an \$11 million allocation for the Walking Iron Trail and the bridge timetable has been moved to 2025 or 2026.

## **8.** WRRTC Financial Report – Huttenburg, Treasurer

Molzof reported nothing out of the ordinary on this month's treasurer's report and interest rates are proving favorable for the commission. We are still waiting on payment from Nicor for annual lease which may become an action item on next month's agenda. Bills for approval include: SWWRPC 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter services in the amount of \$7,777.50 and WSOR 2<sup>nd</sup> payment request for Merrimac Bridge for \$80,606.80. Stern reported that WisDOT has approved the 2<sup>nd</sup> request and will send signed confirmation to Molzof to be added to the record.

Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report and authorize payment for SWWRPC \$7,777.50, and WSOR \$80,606.80. Morris/Larson. Passed Unanimously.

# 9. Wisconsin & Southern Railroad's Report on Operations – Lucht, WSOR

Lucht reported that the bricks have been donated to City of Edgerton; WSOR finished the last of brush spraying for the year last week; WSOR has released their rights and common carrier agreement on the Sauk Subdivision Rails to Trails section and the 60-day window has closed, and amendment to the operating agreement will be necessary; there are 12 private crossings with no permits along the Waukesha Sub and the commission has a right to require an agreement.

## 10. WisDOT Report – Stern - WisDOT.

Stern reported that an amendment to the WSOR and WRRTC operating agreement is in order for the Rails to Trails on the Sauk Sub; Dane County has now taken over for the DNR on the Rails to Trails which will require another amendment to the agreements with WisDOT, Dane County portion of the trail includes multiple bridges; and WSOR is the recipient of FRAP for Bridge #298 by Boscobel, #300 and #310 by Lodi.

## 11. Baraboo Bridge Project B-368 - WSOR, WisDOT, & Baraboo City Representatives

Stern stated that if a Trans 29 permit is issued by WisDOT, it will require Commission approval as the owner of the bridge; design agreements need to be in place between WisDOT and Baraboo; Commission discussed roles and responsibilities as the owner of the structure that is leased to WSOR. City of Baraboo representatives addressed the commission. Lucht stated that the commission owns the bridge and has authority over the bridge and asked the Commission to order the sewer line removed immediately.
