On December 20, 2021, the Town of Oconomowoc Plan Commission recommended conditional approval of the rezone to the Town Board.

TOWN BOARD ACTION:

On January 17, 2022, the Oconomowoc Town Board of Supervisors recommended conditional approval of the rezone.

COMPLIANCE WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (CDP) FOR WAUKESHA COUNTY AND THE TOWN OF OCONOMOWOC CDP:

The property is designated in the Farmland Preservation category on the Comprehensive Development Plan for Waukesha County and in the Prime Agricultural category on the Town Land Use Plan. The proposal to rezone approximately two (2) acres is consistent with plan recommendations that call for a maximum density of one dwelling unit per 35 acres. The remnant acreage will be deed restricted from further non-agricultural development in accordance with Section 6.19 of the Waukesha County Zoning Code and Section 11(i) of the Waukesha County Shoreland and Floodland Protection Ordinance.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The subject property is located northwest of Ashippun Lake in the Saddlebrook Farms subdivision. The property is just over 36 acres and is currently being farmed. There is a 30' storm drainage easement that takes drainage from Saddlebrook Lane across much of the frontage of the parcel and drains to a drainage easement on the neighboring property. There are no environmental features such as corridor or wetland identified on the property.

The lands are zoned Farmland Preservation (FLP) pursuant to the Waukesha County Zoning Ordinances. Plan designations are Farmland Preservation per the Waukesha County Comprehensive Development Plan and Prime Agricultural on the Town of Oconomowoc Land Use Plan. The Farmland Preservation District states that new lots or new residences on less than 35 acres shall only be permitted with the creation and rezoning of a new parcel. The overall density of the farm tract must be maintained at one dwelling unit per 35 acres. Given that the property contains approximately 36 acres in the Farmland Preservation category, the petitioners have one (1) density right for the parcel.

The property owner is proposing to divide two acres from the southwest corner of the property and rezone the property to R-1 Residential for the purpose of constructing a single-family home, utilizing its single development right. The proposed lot contains approximately 158' of frontage along Saddlebrook Lane. A 20 ft. wide access easement is proposed on the west property line to accommodate access to the remnant farm lands, as crossing the existing drainage easement is not feasible. The proposed lot would be entirely within the County's Shoreland and Floodland Protection Ordinance jurisdictional limits.

The proposed parcel complies with the lot size requirements (1 to 3 acres) set forth by the FLP rezoning process, as well as the minimum average width requirements (150 ft.) of the R-1 District. The parcel location and subsequent residence will not limit the agricultural use of the 34-acre remnant farmlands, preserving and maintaining productive and viable agricultural land that adds to the economic base of Waukesha County. The proposed 2-acre parcel meets the Farmland Preservation District siting standards as the new home site will be located near the road, generally clustered with other nearby development, and provide the least disruption to cultivated lands.

The petitioner is also proposing additional agricultural uses on the remnant 34-acres, including a hay and equipment storage building, a commercial stable/boarding operation with approximately 14 stalls and a riding arena, and a personal dog training building for her four dogs that will contain a farmhand living quarters. The horse boarding operation will require a Conditional Use Permit from the town and county. A site plan has not been submitted to the town and county for review at this time. In order to comply with the FLP density requirements of one dwelling unit per 35 acres, it is recommended below that the rezone be conditioned that the remnant farm acreage left in the FLP District be tied via deed restriction to the proposed R-1 Residential lot so that the farmhand living quarters remains accessory to the farm use (riding arena) that is operated by the owner of the adjacent residential parcel. The FLP district allows farm living quarters for full time employees of the farming operation as an agricultural accessory use.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The Planning and Zoning Division Staff recommends this request be <u>approved</u>, subject to the following conditions, which are inclusive of the Town's conditions. Additions to the town's conditions are shown in **bold** and deletions are identified in a strikethrough format.

The Zoning Amendment shall only amend the zoning on the 2.00 acres as shown on the Certified Survey Map dated 10-19-2021, with a revision date of 12/17/2021, including the 20-foot access strip easement along the west side of the property, from the FLP Farmland Preservation District to the R-1 Residential District. No other lands are to be rezoned (see attached Map A (Exhibit A)).

Said restriction must state that the restriction shall apply in perpetuity unless the County Comprehensive **Development** Plan Farmland Preservation designation under both the Town of Oconomowoc Comprehensive Land Use Plan 2035 and the Waukesha County Comprehensive **Development** Plan for the property is amended in the future.
- 4. A Declaration of Restrictions shall be prepared and reviewed and approved by the Town Planner and Waukesha County Planning and Zoning Division and recorded in the Waukesha County Register of Deeds Office that states that the two parcels may not be sold separately until and unless the farm living quarters is removed from the property designated as Farmland Preservation to comply with the density requirements of the Farmland Preservation District. This deed restriction may be combined with the required deed restriction in Condition No. 3.

If approved as conditioned, the zoning change is consistent with Town and County Comprehensive Development Plan recommendations as the 35-acre farmland preservation density requirement is being met. The rezoning of two acres of land will allow the petitioner to construct a residence on a new parcel while not limiting the agricultural use of the remaining farmlands. As conditioned and in accordance with the requirements of the Waukesha County Zoning Codes, a Deed Restriction will be recorded to disclose to future owners that there are no remaining density rights on the original farm tract and the farmhand dwelling unit must remain in same ownership as the residential parcel until and unless it is removed. This will ensure that the 35-acre density is maintained over time and that the vast majority of the land preserved on site remains in productive farmland or agricultural uses. This furthers the goals of the Farmland Preservation Plan to preserve the last remaining five square mile blocks of productive farmland within the County, adding to the economic base of Waukesha County and preserving the rural landscape.







This ordinance authorizes the Community Development Fund to accept excess 2021 CDBG and HOME program income and modifies the budget accordingly. The ordinance also authorizes the carryover of operating expenditure authority for the CDBG, HOME, Coronavirus (CV), and Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA #1) grants from 2021 to 2022 (in the table below).

The department will not be requesting carryover for some previously appropriated grant funding. The U.S. Treasury Department required that \$1,160,963 of the \$12.1 million ERA #1a funding be returned due to lower program spending needs. These funds were then reallocated to the jurisdictions with higher emergency rental needs. The \$5,702,977 of ERA #1a funds requested for carryover exclude the returned amount. In addition, the county was awarded \$14,398,531 of federal rental assistance funding (ERA #1b, Enrolled Ordinance 176-7) allocated through the State of Wisconsin, which will not be spent due to lower program spending needs and is not requested for carryover.


EXISTING PARKING RESTRICTIONS

1 AUTHORIZE THE WAUKESHA COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT TO AMEND THE 2019-2023 2 POLICE PATROL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH THE VILLAGE OF SUSSEX, CREATE AN ADDITIONAL 3 2.00 FTE DEPUTY SHERIFF POSITIONS FOR THE CONTRACT BEGINNING JULY 1, 2022, 4 AND AMEND THE 2022 SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT BUDGET ACCORDINGLY 5 6 7 WHEREAS the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department has provided municipal patrol coverage 8 to the Village of Sussex since 1973; and 9 10 WHEREAS the term of the current police patrol services contract is from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2023; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS the Village of Sussex Board requested that the existing contract with the Waukesha 14 County Sheriff's Department be amended to fund 1.67 FTE Deputy Sheriff coverage for seven-15 days-a-week during second shift and fund all necessary equipment, including an additional 16 vehicle, beginning on July 1, 2022; and 17 18 WHEREAS the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department will need to create 2.00 FTE Deputy 19 Sheriff positions to provide patrol services; and 20 21 WHEREAS the total number of sunset positions related to all of the patrol services contracts would be 39.00 FTE, and total coverage purchased through these contracts is 39.77 FTE, 22 23 meaning that overall patrol contract revenue is sufficient to cover all sunset positions; and 24 25 WHEREAS the proposed contract amendment is a full-cost recovery contract amendment with a 26 2022 cost of \$118,675 for the additional Deputy Sheriff position and other related costs 27 beginning on July 1, 2022; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the contract amendment will require the purchase of a vehicle, estimated to cost 30 \$40,000, which will be funded initially through General Fund balance with costs recovered from 31 the village over the life of the contract. 32 33 THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA ORDAINS that effective 34 July 1, 2022 that two regular full-time Deputy Sheriff positions (2022 salary range \$28.89/hour -35 \$37.75/hour) will be created in the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department with a sunset 36 provision should the Village of Sussex not fund the position in the future. 37 38 BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the Waukesha County Sheriff's Department 2022 budget be 39 modified by increasing charges for services revenues by \$118,675, the use of General Fund 40 balance by \$40,000, and increasing the personnel cost appropriation unit by \$73,820, the 41 operating expense appropriation unit by \$28,150, the interdepartmental charge appropriation 42 unit by \$16,705, and the fixed asset appropriation unit by \$40,000 to fund the positions and the 43 costs associated with the contract expansion. 44 45 BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the 2019-2023 contract for services on file with the Waukesha 46 County Sheriff's Department to provide police services to the Village of Sussex be amended to 47 reflect the desired expansion in patrol services and the Waukesha County Sheriff is authorized 48 to execute the amendment.

This ordinance modifies the existing municipal police patrol services contract with the Village of Sussex, and creates two regular, full-time (2.00 FTE) deputy sheriff positions (salary range \$60,091 - \$78,520). These positions and related costs would be funded entirely by the Village of Sussex. The positions would be authorized to begin on July 1, 2022, and the term of the existing contract ends on December 31, 2023. If the Village of Sussex chooses not to continue funding these positions in future, the positions will sunset.

This ordinance also modifies the 2022 Sheriff's Department budget by increasing expenditure authority and revenue by \$158,675 to cover the costs associated with this contract amendment for the last six months of 2022, as detailed in the table below.

MODIFY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES 2022 BUDGET TO TRANSFER AND APPROPRIATE ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURES FUNDED BY THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT (ARPA) PROVIDED BY FEDERAL CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION THROUGH THE WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SERVICES FOR CONTINUED COVID-19 PANDEMIC RESPONSE

This ordinance modifies the 2022 Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) budget to appropriate \$716,500 of additional expenditure authority in the Special Purpose Grant Fund and increases general government revenue of \$716,500 from Public Health American Rescue Plan Act (PH-ARPA) funding. This ordinance also transfers \$459,279 of existing budget authority and PH-ARPA revenue from the HHS – Public Health Division – General Fund to the Special Purpose Grant Fund.

PH-ARPA can be used for pandemic response, mitigation, and recovery, and the 2022 adopted budget included \$459,279 for a partial-year of funding for these efforts, with a plan to monitor conditions during the year and request the use of additional funds during 2022 if evaluation warranted it. Department management indicate that it is still necessary to continue these efforts with the additional \$716,500 and will shift COVID-19 case investigation and contact tracing efforts to higher-priority prevention and response activities that require fewer temporary staff, in alignment with new recommendations by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services—Public Health Division. Waukesha County will now focus on contacting individuals who are 70 and older, who are not affiliated with a long-term care facility. The additional funding will be used for temporary staff, software, and interdepartmental technology and communication charges.

The 2022 adopted budget originally assumed that the PH-ARPA funding would be accounted for in the Public Health-General Fund budget. The staff managing the funding recommend that these funds be transferred to the Special Purpose Grant Fund to simplify the accounting and reporting of these funds on a project basis (as that fund was intended to facilitate.)

This ordinance results in no direct tax levy impact.
