Pupp provided an update from the March CST meeting. The meeting focused on a discussion of goals for the committee. One of the goals is to have additional trainings for parents, including a collaboration training with Addiction Resource Council (ARC).

4. Committee and Organization Updates

a. HHS Board Liaison

There were no HHS Board Liaison updates.

b. HHS Staff Liaison

Pupp shared that HHS staff have been reviewing ARPA applications. Emails are being sent today to those applicants who were awarded funds. The public award announcements will be coming soon.

Nevicosi announced that ARPA funds are being used to build resources for youth with complex needs and adding additional providers. HHS is looking to add treatment foster care agencies to serve youth with aggressive behaviors, on the autism spectrum, or problematic sexual behaviors. When youth are being placed outside of the home, approximately 50% of the time the youth can go to a relative caregiver, however, youth aged twelve and older and those with complex needs are harder to place.

Members of HHS staff participated in Human Services Day where they met with legislators to advocate for funding for:

- Birth to Three
- Mental health services for crisis intervention
- Community Support Programs
- Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) funding
- Transportation for older adults

c. Aging & Disability Resource Advisory Committee

There were no Aging & Disability Resource Advisory Committee updates.

d. Mental Health Advisory Committee (MHAC)

Brost provided an update from the April MHAC meeting. The focus was on the critical needs presentation. The main topics for the MHAC presentation are transportation needs, peer support specialists, and housing.

f. Substance Use Advisory Committee (SUAC)

There were no SUAC updates.

g. Children's Community Options Program (CCOP)

There were no CCOP updates.

h. Comprehensive Community Services (CCS)

The CCS goal for 2023 is to serve 150 youth. CCS is close to having fully staffed teams and is on pace to reach their goal.

April is Sexual Assault Awareness and Family Strengthening month. The Women's Center has released Public Service Announcements on social media to encourage community members to seek out support.

Variety is partnering with Marquette University's Occupational Therapy Department to provide a series of mental health support workshops for caregivers. The workshops are for parents to learn how to address mental health wellness while the youth work with occupational therapists on fine motor skills and sensory activities. The workshops will be held at the Brookfield Sports Complex every Wednesday from May 31 to August 2. More information to come soon.
