Call to Order

Public Health 3.0 Overview – Ben Jones, Public Health Manager

Ben Jones gave a presentation to the board with an overview of Public Health and the journey to Public Health 3.0:

ADRC Program Updates - Mary Smith, ADRC Manager

Mary Smith gave a presentation on January – June 2022 data from the ADRC Resource Center programs:

- There was a total of 14,833 consumer contacts as of June 2022.
- The most prevalent caller type in 2022 has been from people calling about themselves.
- The most prevalent topic consumers have been calling about are Public Benefits.
- The largest age group that staff have contact with is the 60 years and older population.
 This age group also comprises the largest disability group the ADRC has contact with.
- Aging Services received 695 referrals as of June 2022.
- Adult Protective Services conducted 525 call intakes as of June 2022.

ADRC Manager Report – Mary Smith

- The ADRC management team developed an operational plan for 2022-23 that will guide what they will be focusing on over the next year. The plan covers division work and program work focus.
- The final report from the transportation consultant is in.
- The HHS budget is completed and will be presented to the County Executive.
- In March 2023 the contract with Medicare vans is up and the ADRC is working on a new proposal.

ADRC Coordinator Report – Mary Smith

- Social isolation and loneliness are initiatives the state is focusing on and the ADRC will be participating in these initiatives.
- Staffing updates:
 - o There are 2 Resource Center staff openings.
 - o There is 1 APS Social Worker position open.
 - There are 2 Dining Site Manager positions open.

Health and Human Services Board Report – Mary Baer

The Health and Human Services Board met on June 23, 2022 and the following business was conducted:

- The board approved privileging of 3 doctors from the Clinical Division, including the Clinical Director for the Mental Health Center.
- Ron Pupp, Manager of Adolescent & Family, gave a presentation on the division.
- Liz Aldred, Health and Human Services Director, provided an overview of the Board Supervisor Orientation Handbook.

A Joint Conference Committee and Health and Human Services Board meeting was held on July 1, 2022 and the following business was conducted:

• The Joint Conference Committee recommended to the Health and Human Services Board the removal of the Institute of Mental Disease status and to decertify the Mental Health Center from a 28 bed facility to a 16 bed facility.

The Health and Human Services Board met on July 28, 2022 and the following business was conducted:

- Ben Jones, Public Health Manager, gave a Public Health 3.0 presentation.
- Liz Aldred, Health and Human Services Director, and Lisa Roberts, Health and Human Services Deputy Director, provided updates on the June and July ARPA Ordinances that have been approved.

County Board Report - Joel Gaughan

At the County Board meeting on July 26, 2022, the following Health and Human Services ordinances were approved:

- The **Embedded Clinicians with Law Enforcement Project** will embed 3 Clinical Therapists into law enforcement. One Clinical Therapist will work 1st shift, one will fill the 3rd shift hours, and the third therapist will be involved in Waukesha County dispatch.
- The Expansion of Youth Comprehensive Community Services Programming Project is an additional unit, which will double the number of youths being served, and provides intensive community-based treatment for youth experiencing mental health or substance use issues.
- The Building Child Welfare Infrastructure Project will provide community awards to increase Family First prevention and early intervention evidence-based programs. It will expand local out of home care resources for youth with complex needs and will develop a continuous quality improvement process through implementation of a national systems review model.
