State Street, Room 107 Milwaukee, WI 53233 Re: Death of Cilivea Thyrion (DOB Dear Sheriff Ball: This office has completed its review of an investigation by the Waukesha County Sheriff's Office into the death of Cilivea Thyrion on December 16, 2022, at the Milwaukee County Jail. Ms. Thyrion was residing in the jail since her arrest in February 2022, and subsequent criminal charges for Strangulation and Battery. At times during her stay at the jail between February-December 2022, Ms. Thyrion was housed in Special Needs Pods within the jail due to At other times, she was hospitalized outside the jail for At the time of her death, Ms. Thyrion was housed in a Special Needs Pod that required additional monitoring by jail staff members. On December 16, 2022, Ms. Thyrion indicated to Correctional Officer Latasha Hethington that she needed Hethington and another Correctional assistance because she was Officer, Kamryn Palmer, searched unsuccessfully for any underwear made particularly for those on watch, because standard undergarments are considered to create a risk to be used to self-harm. The correctional officers chose not to provide other standard sanitary accessories because those items are Ultimately, Hethington and Palmer decided to provide Ms. Thyrion with an adult diaper, because, as they indicated to investigators later, they wanted to meet a basic need for Ms. Thyrion and did not consider that the diaper could be used in a way to self-harm. Hethington provided Ms. Thyrion with the diaper just before Ms. Thyrion was allowed out of her individual pod, during which time she was permitted to make telephone calls. Ms. Thyrion had not yet put on the diaper at this time. Hethington returned Ms. Thyrion to her pod at 10:04 a.m., and after some attempt at conversation over the intercom system, returned to her pod at 10:28 a.m. At this time, Ms. Thyrion and Hethington realized that Ms. Thyrion appeared to be indicated that she Hethington summoned additional jail personal who responded to the pod to assist Ms. Thyrion, but they were unable to retrieve anything from inside her mouth, in part due to resistive reactions Ms. Thyrion exhibited toward jail staff attending to her. Additional medical professionals ultimately responded to the

Office. The final autopsy report is still awaiting completion.

pod and applied lifesaving measures that were unsuccessful. Ms. Thyrion was pronounced deceased at 11:13 a.m. The diaper given to Ms. Thyrion remained unworn in her pod with pieces torn off of it.

At this time, pending the completion of the final autopsy report, the evidence in this matter does not support a finding of criminal wrongdoing by the correctional officers who responded to Ms. Thyrion, nor by any other staff member employed at the Milwaukee County Jail. The evidence in this matter does not suggest an intent by staff members to harm Ms. Thyrion, nor that staff members acted with reckless disregard for her safety. In the absence of contrary evidence in the final autopsy report, this office will have concluded its review of this matter and take no further action.
