### What is the Waukesha County 4-H Teen Leaders?

Teen Council is the county 4-H leadership organization for teen 4-H members from any club. Its purpose is to help teen 4-H'ers develop leadership, organizational and life skills, while helping to

build a strong, county 4-H program that benefits all members and volunteers. Teen Council members meet monthly to plan and implement 4-H educational programs, as well as community service and social activities.

#### Membership:

Any Waukesha County 4-H club member from any club, grades 7-12, is eligible to apply to the 4-H Teen Council. Members must commit to attend at least 75% of monthly meetings and activities. Membership runs August- July of each year.

#### Leadership Skills:

Brainstorming, Coming to Consensus, Motivating Others, Project Management, Conflict Resolution, Team Building, Getting people involved, resume writing, Interviewing, Marketing & Promotions, Parliamentary Procedure, Officer skills, etc.

#### **Possible Activities:**

Guest Speakers, Field Trips, Fair Promotion, Leadership Conventions, Collaborating on countywide activity and events such as 4-H Banquets, Family Fun Day, Officer training, Wisconsin 4-H Fall Forum trip, etc.

#### What have teen leaders done in the past?

Designed and coordinated countywide T-shirt sales, Brainstorming sessions, Elevator Speech seminar, online live meetings, learning icebreakers and more. Guest speakers have included a local bank manager, a human resources representative from a large corporation, a K-9 dog and police officer, and County Executive Paul Farrow. Countywide activities such as ice skating, tubing, roller skating, pumpkin farm and more!
