Measles Shot Available at Waukesha County Clinic

Waukesha, WIS. – The public can get the Measles-Mumps-Rubella vaccine (MMR) at the regularly scheduled Waukesha County Public Health Division immunization clinic on Wednesday, April 16 from 4 – 6 p.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church in Waukesha.

Persons who do not have a known exposure to measles are encouraged to be vaccinated according to the usual recommendations. Persons who are exposed to measles should consult their health care provider. The usual measles vaccine schedule is:

- First dose at 12 months of age
- Second dose at 4-6 years of age
- Adults born in or after 1957 should have one measles vaccine
- Adults born before 1957 are presumed to be immune and don't need a vaccine

People that want the vaccination are encouraged to bring their immunization records to the clinic. No child under 12 months of age will receive the MMR vaccine, and a signature from parents or legal guardians is required to have children over that age immunized. The fee is \$7 for each vaccine dose, but may be waived if necessary.

Trinity Lutheran Church is located at 1052 Whiterock Avenue. Clinic visitors must enter through the Baxter Street entrance.
