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**WAUKESHA COUNTY ANNOUNCES NEXT ROUND OF PUBLIC, H1N1
FLU VACCINATION CLINICS TO BEGIN NEXT WEEK**

Clinics will be held for identified target groups in Waukesha County

WAUKESHA, Wis. – Waukesha County Public Health Division will begin the next round of free, H1N1 vaccination clinics Tuesday, November 10th. The clinics are intended to provide both the intranasal and injectable H1N1 vaccine to Waukesha County residents in the following targeted groups:

- Health care and emergency medical personnel who have direct contact with patients or infectious material
- Pregnant women
- Children age 6 months to 4 years
- Persons who live with or provide care for infants age 6 months or younger, such as parents, siblings, daycare providers
- Children and adolescents age 5 to 18 years who have medical conditions that put them at higher risk for influenza-related complications

The H1N1 vaccination will be given on a first come, first serve basis until the vaccine supply runs out at the Waukesha County Expo Center Forum Building on the following dates and times:

- Tuesday, November 10th from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- Thursday, November 12th from 1 p.m. to 6 p.m.
