

Corrective Sanctions Program (CSP)

Overview

Description: Corrective Sanctions Program was primarily developed to move youth from a correctional institution to intensive community supervision. However, juvenile courts may directly place youth in CSP at time of disposition. CSP is a six month program utilizing electronic monitoring, strict seven day a week schedule, and a heightened level of community supervision overall. CSP includes a level system that offers incentives for positive behavior and sanctions for negative behavior. All DJC community supervision offices have CSP staff; however, CSP supervision is available statewide even in counties without a formal CSP office.
