

Intoxicated Driver Intervention

Overview

Description: The Intoxicated Driver Intervention Program is a court intervention program that aims to connect the repeat OWI offender with assessment and treatment as soon as possible after arrest and before conviction. Offenders are monitored and allowed to live in the community while awaiting their court dates, as long as they comply with their court-ordered bond conditions. Participants may volunteer for SCRAM (Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitoring) monitoring as a sanction to increase compliance or to reduce the number of supervision appointments.

Started: 1999

Capacity: 400

Goals: The goal of the program is to assist persons arrested and charged with Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) for the second or more time in participating in treatment. The program is aimed at reducing the rate of recidivism among repeat intoxicated drivers.

Incentives: Compliance with the program requirements and treatment may result in a reduced jail sentence.
