Overview

Description: Norris residential care offers specialty treatment in anger management, sex offenders, substance abuse, mental health, and cognitively delayed sex-offenders. By focusing on primary treatment needs, clients are able to move to less intensive levels of care in a timely manner. A thirty day assessment/stabilization program is also offered. Norris is a TYPE II facility. All residential units are equipped with single bedrooms. Norris clinicians include Psychiatrist, Psychologist, Neuropsychologist, Physician and Therapists who all work with the child and his family. The individual treatment plan completed by the Team guides the direction of services implemented. Residential Care includes education at the DPI certified on-campus school. Norris operates three group homes, all located on the Norris campus. The homes provide a comfortable family-group atmosphere with resources of a treatment center. The Berman House group home is focused on the continued treatment needs of a client that is recovering from substance abuse issues. The Fannie Wells group home focuses on clients that have special needs that require additional supervision- These youth all have their own bedrooms. The Schroeder House group home focuses on clients at the Norris Public School on-grounds. Clinical Services may be accessed through the Norris Outpatient Clinic.
