

Operating After Revocation (OAR) Program

Overview

Description: The OAR Program screens all offenders with operating after revocation charges in order to assist any eligible defendants unrepresented by legal counsel with the reinstatement process to obtain their driver's license. The program shares information from the screening with the Court and the District Attorney in order to assist with decision-making.

Started: 2004

Capacity: 260

Goals: The goal of the OAR Program is to reduce calendar congestion and court appearances by screening OAR cases to move them through the system in an efficient manner.

Incentives: Eligible defendants are able to re-gain their driving privileges in a timely manner after completion of the program and often have their charge amended to a zero point ordinance violation.
