

Family (Non-Jury) Courtroom Features

PRESENTATION CART

Court participants may use the courtrooms' evidence presentation cart to assist with their presentations.

The cart has the following features:

- **Document Camera** - The document camera/visual presenter/"Elmo" can display documents and small objects on the Courtrooms' video monitors. The camera can front light opaque documents, back lighting transparencies is not available.
- **Wireless Microphone** - A handheld OR lapel (clip-on) wireless microphone is available if mobility is preferred during a presentation.

PARTICIPANT TABLES

The three participant tables are fitted with a 22" touch screen LCD monitor. Court participants can also annotate from these touch screen monitors. A SVGA computer input port and an audio input jack are also available. ***(The personal computer must be supplied by the litigant.)**

WITNESS BOX

Annotation/Evidence Viewing Monitor - A touch screen video display monitor allows the witness to annotate. Electronic enhancement does not alter the original object, document, photograph, or electronic image.

ASSISTED LISTENING

The courtroom is fitted with a two channel, infrared assisted listening system. Channel one is used for the hearing impaired. Channel two is used for foreign language translation. The court will provide compatible infrared headsets. The jury box and the gallery are fitted with headphone jacks for the hearing impaired.

PUBLIC VIEWING AREA

An optional Public display can be placed in the courtroom IF IT IS REQUESTED.

COURTROOM CAMERAS

Courtroom cameras are installed at various locations to capture the Judge, Witness, Prosecution table, and Defense table. The camera feeds can be seen in the courtroom through the evidence presentation system.

TELECONFERENCING

All courtrooms have teleconferencing systems. If more than two parties are needed on a call, a phone bridging service will need to be use. Advance notice to use a bridging service is REQUIRED.

BENCH CONTROLS

The Judge and courtroom Deputy Clerk have the ability to control all aspects of the electronic presentation system. The bench can select the video source and volume control of the presentation system at all times. The Judge and Deputy Clerk can also make adjustments to all microphones in the courtroom.

CLERK'S WORKAREA

The DVD player can display prerecorded video/audio presentations that are on a DVD. The court cannot guarantee that all forms of DVDs can be played via our DVD player. If the DVD plays on a laptop, it is a good idea to bring a laptop in to court to present the video evidence.
