WET stands for Water Education for Teachers. Wisconsin values its water resources! With almost 15,000 lakes, 33,000 miles of rivers and streams, and 5.3 million acres of wetlands within its borders, Wisconsin needs to protect these waterways. Project WET is a nonprofit water education program and publisher for educators and young people ages 5-18. The program is organized nationally, but delivered on a statewide basis. It is designed to facilitate and promote awareness, appreciation, knowledge, and stewardship of water resources through the dissemination of classroom-ready teaching aids.

The core of the program is the Project WET Curriculum and Activity Guide (Grades K-12), a collection of water-related, fun, hands-on, and easy-to-use activities. The 90-plus activities incorporate a variety of formats such as large and small group learning, laboratory investigations, discussion of local and global topics, and involvement in community service projects. Supplementary resources are available to complement and enrich many of the activities.

In this two-day workshop, you will learn to understand our water resources and how to protect them. You will be engaged in many of the activities from the guide and actually testing a waterway. Ideas to incorporate these activities into the classroom in social studies, english, art and math will be shared. Group discussions will be an integral part of your day.

You will leave this workshop with the Project WET Curriculum and Activity Guide as well as a host of additional resources for use in your classroom. Best of all, you will leave having had fun!
