


Conditions Currently Recognized by VA as Related to Agent Orange Exposure

- ◆ * **Acute & Subacute Peripheral Neuropathy**
- ◆ AL Amyloidosis
- ◆ B Cell Leukemias
(such as hairy cell leukemia)
- ◆ * **Chloracne**
- ◆ Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia
- ◆ Diabetes Mellitus (Type 2)
- ◆ Hodgkin's Disease
- ◆ Ischemic Heart Disease
- ◆ Multiple Myeloma
- ◆ Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma
- ◆ Parkinson's Disease
- ◆ * **Porphyria Cutanea Tarda**
- ◆ Prostate Cancer
- ◆ Respiratory Cancers
- ◆ Soft Tissue Sarcoma
other than:
(*Osteosarcoma, Chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's Sarcoma, or Mesohelioma*)
- ◆ Spina Bifida in children of veterans
(*not including Spina Bifida Occulta*)
* Needs to manifest itself within one year of last exposure to Agent Orange.

Eligibility for Agent Orange Related Compensation

Claim for a Condition officially recognized by VA as Related to Agent Orange Exposure

Exposure to Agent Orange is conceded if a veteran served in Vietnam. However, the veterans will still need to submit the following evidence:

- ◆ Proof of service in Vietnam during war time
(January 9, 1962—May 7, 1975)
- ◆ Medical documentation of the condition(s) officially recognized by VA

Claim for a Condition not officially recognized by VA as Related to Agent Orange Exposure

If a veteran has been diagnosed with a condition(s) not shown at the left, he/she may submit a claim with the following supporting evidence:

- ◆ Medical documentation (preferably a confirmed diagnosis) of the claimed condition and
- ◆ An opinion from a doctor stating that it is as likely as not that the condition is the result of Agent Orange exposure
- ◆ Proof of service in Vietnam during war time
(January 9, 1962—May 7, 1975)

Other Birth Defects in Children of Female Vietnam Veterans

Public law 106-419 authorizes the Secretary of the VA to award monetary payments, vocational rehabilitation, and medical benefits to the children of female Vietnam veterans born with certain birth defects, other than spina bifida. The recognized birth defects, identified by the Secretary of VA, are based on a study looking at the Vietnam experience for female veterans; it was not a herbicide exposure study. This law applies to female veterans who served in Vietnam during the period of February 28, 1961—May 7, 1975.
