## **Governor Doyle Appoints William Domina as Waukesha County Circuit Court Judge**

MADISON – Governor Jim Doyle announced today the appointment of William Domina to the Waukesha County Circuit Court. Domina will fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Judge Robert Mawdsley. He will begin serving in February and will serve a term ending July 31, 2011.
