#### **Advisory and Standing Committee Reports**

The ADRC Advisory Board has two new board members, Pamela Franke and roman Schulteis. Kathy Glaser, Dementia Care Specialist presented on the Trualta website (<a href="www.trualta.com">www.trualta.com</a>). Trualta is a free resource that shares education, videos, articles, courses, and tool kits to caregivers.

Amy Meyer has been hired as an ADRC Coordinator. Lisa Bittman will oversee Volunteer Services and Resource Center Operations. Amy Meyer will oversee Aging, Nutrition and Transportation and Adult Protective Services.

The Public Health Advisory Committee met on February 9. The division continues to prepare for the 140 Review at the end of September, developing an internal process to compile everything that is needed. CHIP continues to recruit additional members; however, they hope to launch the Action Teams by March. Public Health has been interviewing for the Overdose Fatality Review Social Worker based out of the medical examiner's office, a full-time nurse, a .8 nurse as well as a part-time preparedness staff member.

Felicia Behnke Shaw distributed and reviewed a PowerPoint presentation titled, "National Culturally Linguistically Appropriate Service Standards" at the Substance Use Advisory Committee meeting on February 21. Xylazine, a horse tranquilizer, is becoming more prevalent in the community.

Dallmann-Papke was not available to provide an update from the Mental Health Advisory Committee meeting.

Menefee distributed and reviewed "Waukesha County Youth Risk Behavior Survey: 2021 High School Spotlight" results document from the February 16 Child and Family Services Advisory Committee Meeting. The survey was administered to students across public schools in Waukesha County in 2021 and it provides a window into the physical, mental health and emotional well-being of Waukesha County youth. Students were asked about motor vehicle safety, school safety, mental health, sexual behavior, tobacco, alcohol, drug use, online behavior, physical health nutrition, trauma, adversity, protective factors and more. Out of the 27 public schools in Waukesha County, 16 participated in the survey.
