### What is Chatter Matters?

Chatter Matters Communication Camp is an overnight camp for children who use augmentative or alternative communication (AAC) and up to four of their immediate family members. Children and their families learn to improve communication using their devices while participating in traditional camp activities such as arts and crafts, talent shows, games, adaptive relay races, as well as continuing education and networking for families.

### Who should attend?

- Children ages 5 to 15 years who use AAC (e.g., Tobii DynaVox, Vantage Lite, iPad with AAC applications, Proloquo2Go, etc.)
- At least one parent/guardian seeking to learn more about AAC, in general, and their child's use of AAC in particular, who will attend the entire camp with them
- Immediate family members (up to five, including the AAC user and at least one parent/guardian)
- Families who want to have fun while improving their general communication competency using AAC
