Total number of veterans in Waukesha County as of December 31, 2010, per VA figures was 29,246. This does not include the number of dependents of veterans which when added with the veteran population can easily be 60,000 to 70,000 Waukesha County residents.

Veterans have special needs that resulted from their service to their country. Some of these needs are compensation and medical treatment for service-connected disabilities, and help in making adjustments in their lives. They also might need assistance in obtaining an education to enable them to find and maintain gainful employment.


In 2010, there were 8,428 incoming phone calls, 3,370 e-mails and 4,104 client visits to the office. A total of 97 referrals to other federal, state, and county providers for additional services were made during the year. A total of 63 appearances on behalf of veterans were made during the year.

The degree of economic impact that veterans' programs have on our county may be revealed by the following totals of state and federal benefits paid to Waukesha County veterans and their dependents or survivors. The economic impact does not include any multiplier factor when these dollars are used to purchase goods and services in the county time and time again.



VETERANS SERVICE COMMISSION

The amount of expenditures by the Veterans Service Commission in 2010 was \$4,591 for Veterans Relief, and administrative expenditures for the Veterans Service Commissioners were \$1,381. The Commission met five times in 2010. Funding from other Veterans Service Organizations provided an additional \$9,663 in financial assistance.

VETERANS INDIGENT BURIALS

There were no inquiries for Indigent Veteran Burials in 2010.

The Veteran Service Office is a very cost effective operation of county government. The 2010 Budget of \$293,717, which \$280,717 was from the Tax Levy, resulted in a return of \$128,534,000 federal and state dollars to Waukesha County veterans and their dependents. This equates to \$457.88 return for every Levy dollar invested.
