Introduction of Guests and Committee Members

Approval of Minutes – December 10, 2020

Provider Forum

Discussion was held on the operating while intoxicated (OWI) process including driver's safety plans, assessments, treatment programs and length of treatment, non-compliance issues and sentencing.

Chair Report

- Intoxalock coupons for free installation are available to providers if interested.
- Waukesha County has received the Urban Women's Substance Use Services grant. The grant will be used to launch the Women's Health and Recovery Project (WHARP). The grant is geared toward women with complex needs and substance use disorders.
- The Medicaid residential substance use disorder benefit was released in February. This means Medicaid now has benefits available for residential substance use treatment.

HHS Board Liaison Update

- Currently, the focus of the board is on vaccinations for county residents.

Agency Updates

- Addiction Resource Council (ARC): In-person assessments will begin March 22nd. ARC reported seeing an increase in assessments from individuals who have had DUI's from 10 or more years ago. The new address for ARC is N27 W23960 Paul Road, Suite 5, Pewaukee, WI 53072.
- Lt. Niles shared the statistical operating while intoxicated (OWI) crash and fatality report. The report will be emailed to IPID committee members.
- The 16th Street clinic has resumed seeing patients regularly in-person.
- Health and Human Services has resumed seeing patients in-person.


