The meeting was called to order at 8:36 a.m.

Introduction of Guests and Committee Members

Committee members and guests introduced themselves.

Approval of Minutes – December 12, 2019

Minutes from the December 12, 2019 meeting were reviewed. Holloway moved, second by Mangers, to approve the minutes as written. Motion carried.

Provider Forum

Discussion was held on drug trends currently being seen within Waukesha County and driver safety plan (DSP) treatment requirements. Dettlaff and Holloway explained group dynamics and discussed the benefits of insurance coverage for groups. The biggest barrier however, is the time constraints of the groups as many people have full-time jobs and/or transportation issues. Cuevas reported that the DOT receives calls frequently inquiring about how to set up a DSP. Mangers reported that follow up recommendations typically are not added to the DSP because there is no way to monitor compliance. Providers may submit follow ups on the Addiction Resource Council (ARC) form or on the provider letterhead. Clients that have a valid prescription for controlled substance and are facing OWI charges, can be placed in non-compliance and be required to obtain a doctor approval to drive. The Victim Impact panel is held 4 times per year. Individuals typically are sent if they have 3 or more OWI's but first time offenders can be sent as well. Discussion was held on obtaining outcomes and the best way to collect data. It was suggested that this could be something the IPID committee explore at some point. Discussion was held on the use of the Wisconsin Prescription Drug Monitory Program (PDMP), it uses and how it is beneficial to providers.

Chair Report

Iris Health Clinic has been approved as a DSP provider.

The annual Health and Human Services (HHS) Public Hearing will be taking place at 7:00 p.m. on April 1st in the Public Health Department. All are welcome to attend.
