

OPEN MEETING MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 8:35 a.m.

Introduction of Guests and Committee Members

Committee members and guests introduced themselves.

Approval of Minutes – June 11, 2020

Minutes from the June 11, 2020 meeting were reviewed. Holmes moved, second by Niles, to approve the minutes as written. Motion carried.

Substance Use Prevention Services in Waukesha County – Working Upstream of Intoxicated Driving

Just presented Substance Use Prevention Services Working Upstream of Intoxicated Driving. Just reported that the Addiction Resource Council (ARC) is an assessment only facility, not a treatment facility. There are some counties in Wisconsin whose assessing facilities are also treatment facilities for the intoxicated driver.

Opper joined the meeting at 8:53 a.m.

Anyone in Waukesha County that receives an operating while intoxicated (OWI) charge is required to report to the ARC for an assessment. The ARC surveys all intoxicated driver clients to help guide the intervention program and identify gaps to help reduce intoxicated driving recidivism. Survey data shows that Wisconsin resident's perception of driving high (marijuana, heroin, prescription drugs, etc.) is not as much of a risk as driving under the influence of alcohol. The Intoxicated Driver Program (IDP) is an intervention program whose goal is to reduce OWI recidivism. All IDP clients receive a referral, either for education through classes held at WCTC or for treatment.

Just also reported on the UTURN program which is designed to subset the current education that is provided in a driver's education course. In this program students learn what impaired driving is, why it is unsafe to drive impaired, and the legal issues that stem from an OWI. Just will forward the presentation to committee members.

Mangers joined the meeting at 9:06 a.m.

Chair Report

- The Wisconsin Alcohol Policy Seminar will be held virtually this year on October 8th. There will be workshops and breakout groups held throughout the day on a number of topics. Registration is required and the cost for the seminar is \$75.00.
- Upcoming state conferences for the months of September and October include: Prevent Suicide Wisconsin 10th Annual Conference, Crisis Intervention, NAMI Growing Stronger Together, Mental Health and Substance Use Recovery Training Conference and, Children Come First Conference. Anticipate that many if not most of the conferences will be virtual or at least have a virtual option.
- Waukesha County was able to increase mobile crisis prevention by adding a mobile van 1 day/week. Talk is underway currently to increase van availability to an additional day in 2021.
- Opiate Overdose Awareness Day was held August 31st. Events included naloxone trainings and a candlelight vigil in remembrance of overdose victims and their families.
- September is National Recovery Month. The AODA Volunteers of Waukesha County are offering an individual option for counseling via phone.

HHS Board Liaison Update

- Waukesha County continues to work on the budget for the upcoming year.

Agency Updates

- The ARC has moved to a new location. Their new address is:
N27W23960 Paul Road, Suite 5, Pewaukee, 53072
- The Department of Transportation signed an agreement with Waukesha County Technical College for an emergency policy to modify online courses. The policy is now opened to traffic safety courses for online delivery and is effective through 6/30/21.
- Lt. Niles provided driving/crash statistics for Waukesha County. Total crashes year-to-date for Waukesha County are 3,788. Of those crashes, 155 were alcohol related year-to-date, with 57 injuries and 2 fatalities.
