# **Juvenile Court Update**

#### Mental Health Center (MHC) Redesign Project Update

Kirk Yauchler updated the group on the MHC project, reporting that the Regional Crisis Facility/Crisis Resource Center construction is completed. The contracted vendor, Center for Independence, is set up at the facility and currently recruiting staff. The target opening date of the facility is December 15, with a ribbon cutting and open house tentatively scheduled for December 11. The construction on the inpatient unit is set to be completed by the end of December.

#### **Courthouse Construction Project Update**

Bugenhagen gave a brief update that the courthouse construction is continuing to progress with no major updates since the last meeting.

# **CJCC Committee Updates**

#### **Pretrial**

Paz reported that the November meeting was canceled and the next meeting is on January 10.

#### Case Processing

Opper reported that the committee is meeting tomorrow and continues to discuss pretrial conferencing and will begin discussing court exhibit storage protocol.

#### **Alternative Interventions**

Perri reported that the committee is meeting next on December 5.

#### Mental Health

Aldred reported that the committee met on Monday and discussed a new data tracking log for Emergency Detentions, the City of Waukesha Police Department receiving a federal grant for an additional embedded crisis worker, and an embedded worker being added at the Brookfield Police Department. Reilly added that there are many other mayors in the county that are also interested in having embedded crisis workers within their police departments.

#### Victims' Rights

Luczaj reported that the committee met on November 7 and reviewed 2024 goals which will focus on restitution and reviewing the newly released WI Crime Victims' Rights Board Report on Restitution. The committee will be increasing their meeting frequency from quarterly to every other month in 2024.
