REPEAL AND RECREATE TABLE 6(b)1.B.ii. OF THE WAUKESHA COUNTY SHORELAND AND FLOODLAND PROTECTION ORDINANCE TO INCORPORATE THE LAITSCH DAM FAILURE ANALYSIS (RZ118)

WHEREAS, the Waukesha County Board of Supervisors enacted the Waukesha County Shoreland and Floodland Protection Ordinance on January 23, 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Waukesha County Board of Supervisors may make amendments to such Ordinance pursuant to Section 59.692; and

WHEREAS, the matter of this Ordinance having been duly referred to and considered by the Waukesha County Park and Planning Commission, after Public Hearing and the giving of requisite notice of said hearing and the recommendation thereon reported to the Land Use, Parks and Environment Committee and the Waukesha County Board of Supervisors, as required by Section 59.692, Wis. Stats.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF WAUKESHA ORDAINS that Table 6(b)1.B.ii. of the Waukesha County Shoreland and Floodland Protection Ordinance is repealed and recreated to read as follows:

LOCATION:

The properties affected by the rezone amendment are located in Section 34 and the S ½ of Section 27 in the Town of Genesee (T6N, R18E) as well as the NW ¼ of Section 3 and the NE ¼ of Section 4 in the Town of Mukwonago (T5N, R18E). Maps of the area and an informational letter were provided with the notices sent to the individual property owners affected. Exhibit A specifically identifies the proposed C-1 Conservancy Overlay District boundary based on the Dam Failure Zone. The information can also be viewed on the Waukesha County GIS website at: <u>https://www.waukeshacounty.gov/interactivemap/</u>. The dam failure layer is noted as "Draft dam failure (Willow Springs Dam) and is located within the "Floodplains FEMA and Other Sources" layer group on GIS.

EXISTING ZONING:

The dam failure study area extends across roughly 135 acres of land. Except for approximately 3,000 sq. ft. of land currently subject to Town of Genesee zoning, all lands are currently zoned C-1 Conservancy Overlay District. With respect to base zoning, most of lands are zoned HG High Groundwater District, with the remainder of lands in the A-1 Agricultural District. It should be noted that there is no proposal to amend base zoning designations, just the overlay zoning district boundaries.

PROPOSED ZONING:

The proposal would amend the text and map of the Waukesha County Shoreland and Floodland Protection Ordinance (SFPO) in order to adopt the dam failure analysis (study) for the Laitsch Dam. The hydraulic shadow of the dam failure analysis is proposed to be mapped as an additional floodplain boundary along Spring Brook from the Laitsch Dam to approximately 8,500 feet downstream of the dam. Only one (1) lot within the entire study area contains lands within the dam failure shadow that are not already zoned C-1 Conservancy (Floodplain) Overlay District due to the existing 100-year floodplain. The single lot impacted is an outlot in the Fields Crossing subdivision which currently has a substantial area of C-1 Conservancy Overlay District zoning due to an area of mapped floodplain. The outlot, which is fractionally owned by all subdivision lot owners, is used for stormwater purposes and is not buildable. That outlot would see roughly 2,800 sq. ft. of additional lands become subject to C-1 Conservancy (Floodplain) Overlay District due to the rezone action. In addition, because the County's shoreland jurisdictional limits extend to the full extent of the floodplain limits, the small area of the above noted outlot would become subject to shoreland jurisdiction since the floodplain in this section extends further than 300 feet from Spring Brook. Lastly, the table of official floodplain maps and studies in Section 6(b)1.B.ii of the SFPO will be repealed and re-created in its entirety (see Exhibit B).

All undeveloped floodplains within the county's zoning jurisdictional area are zoned C-1 Conservancy District Overlay. The C-1 Conservancy Overlay District of the Waukesha County SFPO contains unique standards for wetlands, floodplains and floodways. These standards are Referred on: 07/27/23 File Number: 178-O-036 Referred to: LU 4 described within the zoning district text and are further identified throughout the other general sections of the ordinance. Properties with overlays maintain their base zoning districts, while natural resources are mapped within layers on top of the base zoning districts. As noted above, wetlands, floodplains and floodways are uniquely identified on the official county zoning maps. The county's floodplain zoning standards have been approved by both the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and the DNR.

PUBLIC REACTION:

- Town of Genesee: None
- Town of Mukwonago: A question was asked at the hearing regarding any impacts to flood insurance requirements due to the zoning change. County staff noted that this change would not impact National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements since the dam failure rezone is not based on a hazard zone established from a Federal Insurance Rate Map (FIRM).

TOWN OF GENESEE PLAN COMMISSION AND BOARD ACTION:

On May 27, 2023, the Town of Genesee Plan Commission recommended <u>approval</u> of the request to the Town Board.

On May 27, 2023, the Town of Genesee Plan Board recommended <u>approval</u> of the text and map amendment to Waukesha County.

TOWN OF MUKWONAGO

On June 7, 2023, the Town of Mukwonago Plan Commission unanimously recommended approval of the request to the Town Board.

On June 7, 2023, the Town of Mukwonago Plan Board unanimously recommended approval of the text and map amendment to Waukesha County.

<u>COMPLIANCE WITH THE COMPREHENSIVE DEVELOPMENT PLAN (CDP) FOR</u> WAUKESHA COUNTY AND THE TOWNS OF GENESEE AND MUKWONAGO CDP:

Prevention of flooding is a key natural resource protection recommendation of both the Town and County CDPs, and the proposed rezoning will protect the newly studied floodplain from fill and prevent future property damage and personal injury for the portion of the properties to be rezoned and on the properties upstream and downstream of the subject area.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

A dam failure study has recently been completed by Stormwater Solutions Engineering for the Laitsch Dam, which is located on Willow Spring Lake and is managed by the Spring Brook Watershed Lake Management District. The dam, located in the Town of Mukwonago, defines the upstream extent of the study area with the downstream extent in the Town of Genesee where a bridge serving State Highway 83 crosses over Spring Brook.

NR116 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code requires areas downstream of dams be zoned and regulated to reduce potential loss of life and property. The WDNR has recently advised Waukesha

County that the study must be adopted on zoning maps and be referenced in the official maps section of the Waukesha County Shoreland and Floodland Protection Ordinance. As a result, the C-1 Conservancy (Floodway) Overlay District must be expanded to match the boundaries of the dam failure shadow.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Based on the above analysis, the Planning and Zoning Division staff recommend **approval** of the request.

As noted above, NR116 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code requires that areas downstream of dams shall be zoned and regulated by municipalities with floodplain zoning ordinances to reduce potential loss of life and property located downstream of dams.

Rezoning the dam failure shadow as floodplain or floodway within the C-1 Conservancy Overlay District on the County zoning map prevents development within said areas, which ultimately protects the subject landowners and downstream property owners and their improvements from flooding danger. Over 99.9% of the lands with the dam failure study are already under a C-1 Conservancy Overlay zoning designation and the remaining affected lands are located in an undevelopable outlot. Approval of the request is consistent with the purpose and intent of the ordinance and follows CDP recommendations.




