# Let's Cook! Easy Taco Macaroni and Cheese By: thelazydish.com

## Let's Craft! Snowflake Suncatchers By: Kidsactivityzone.com

Bring some color into your home during the winter months with these fun unique snowflake suncatchers!

#### What You'll Need:

- Press n Seal Wrap or Clear Contact Paper
- Issue Paper Assorted Colors
- ∠ Scissors

#### What You'll Do:

- 1. Begin by making your snowflake.
- 2. Once your snowflake is cut, unfold the paper to see your design.
- 3. Tear a sheet of Press n Seal wrap or clear contact paper.
- 4. Press the snowflake into the wrap.
- 5. Cut a bunch of squares of the tissue paper.
- 6. Press the tissue paper into the open spaces of the snowflake.
- 7. Once finished applying the tissue paper, tear another sheet of wrap and position over the tissue paper, sealing in place.
- 8. Trim all the excess wrap from around the snowflake. (Tip: Make sure that your scissors are clean or they may stick, making it difficult to cut!)
- 9. Hang your colorful designs in the window and watch how the light makes the colors glow!

## Let's Cook! 3-Ingredient No-Bake Hershey's Pie By: thelazydish.com

#### Ingredients:

- ✓ 1 (6oz) Pre-Made Graham Cracker Crust
- 6 Regular-Sized Hershey's Chocolate Bars (About 9oz)



#### Instructions:

- . Break apart your Hershey's bars and reserve 2-4 pieces for garnishing the pie later. Place them in a microwave-safe bowl and heat for 20-30 second increments until


