

<b>Waukesha Day Reporting Center</b>	
<b>Description</b>	<p>The Waukesha Day Reporting Center (DRC) provides case management, employment services, and intensive supervision to Huber inmates and direct court referrals as an alternative to incarceration in the jail or Huber Facility. The Department of Community Corrections also utilizes the program as an alternative to revocation.</p> <p>The primary goals of the program are to provide intensive community supervision to assist in reducing the jail and Huber populations as well as to provide support with participant's needs to assist them with long-term positive change in their lives. The program utilizes SCRAM CAM and GPS technology to monitor offenders deemed appropriate for a higher level of supervision. Supervision includes potential placement on electronic monitoring, weekly appointments at the DRC office located at Huber, and random alcohol and drug testing. DRC staff conduct risk and needs assessments, refer to community resources, and monitor involvement in treatment and other services to meet offenders' needs.</p> <p><b>In 2017, the program served 201 participants: 84% successfully completed the Day Report Center and over 8,400 jail days were saved.</b></p>
