

Waukesha Drug Treatment Court	
Description	<p>The Waukesha Drug Treatment Court (DTC) provides case management to adult offenders struggling with drug addiction and who are pending non-violent felony charges with the court. The program follows the state and national standards for Treatment Courts to include the 10 key components. The Waukesha County Drug Treatment Court offers participants the opportunity to break the cycle of addiction, improve the chances of a sober, crime free, and healthy life and contribute to a safe community through intensive supervision and case management.</p> <p>The case managers provide: initial risk and needs assessment screening, monitoring and support, referrals AODA assessments and treatment – as well as to other community resources as needs are identified, conducts random alcohol and drug testing, provides continuous alcohol monitoring with the utilization of SCRAM CAM technology, provides GPS monitoring for clients as a sanction for non-compliance, ensures clients are notified and attend each court hearing, and provides staffing reports prior to every staffing and court session, as well as immediate notification of violations to the Alcohol Treatment Court Team (DOCC, District Attorney, private attorney or public defender, the Judge, DHHS representative, Sheriff representative), and provides recommendations for incentives and sanctions for compliance and non-compliance. DTC is a 4-phase program and participants move through each phase, depending on their compliance, towards graduation.</p> <p>In 2017, the DTC served 87 participants; 98 participants have graduated since 2012. The average length of stay in DTC is 460 days.</p>
