Description	The Waukesha Pretrial Intoxicated Driver Intervention Program (IDIP) provides intensive supervision for drunk drivers charged with a second or greater OWI offense shortly after arrest in an effort to get them into treatment as soon as possible during the pretrial phase. Compliance with program requirements and treatment <i>may</i> result in reduced jail sentence. The program is aimed at reducing the rate of pretrial recidivism among repeat drunk drivers. The program provides monitoring and support; referrals to Driver Safety, AODA assessment and treatment, and to other community resources as needs are identified; conducts random alcohol and drug testing; provides continuous alcohol monitoring with the utilization of SCRAM CAM technology; and ensures clients are notified and attend each court hearing. In 2017, WCS served over 700 defendants: 96% attended all court appearances, 4% were re-arrested, and 4,800 pretrial jail days were saved.
