Description	The Waukesha Pretrial Supervision Program monitors adult offenders charged with misdemeanors and some felonies who are awaiting trial or adjudication in order to ensure their appearance at court hearings. In addition to ensuring court appearances, pretrial supervision is designed to reduce pretrial misconduct. The program also assists in referrals for community-based services such as AODA or mental health treatment. Pretrial supervision provides the Court an alternative to pretrial incarceration. In 2017, WCS served over 400 defendants: 86% attended all court appearances, 3% were re-arrested, and 12,837 pretrial jail days were saved.
