<b>WI Forest Landowner Grant Program (WFLGP)</b>	A cost-sharing program that provides funding for stewardship practices on private land. Up to 50% of the eligible costs can be refunded upon completion of the work. Landowner grant applications are accepted continuously but processed only four times a year - February 1, May 1, August 1, and November 1. Applications are funded based on priority. <b>Conservation Reserve Program (CRP)</b>	Voluntary program for agricultural landowners. Through CRP, you can receive annual rental payments and cost-share assistance to establish long-term, resource conserving covers on eligible farmland. The Commodity Credit Corporation (CCC) makes annual rental payments based on the agriculture rental value of the land, and provides cost-share assistance for up to 50 percent of the participant's costs in establishing approved conservation practices. Participants enroll in CRP contracts for 10 to 15 years. <b>Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP)</b>	Voluntary conservation program that encourages producers to address resource concerns in a comprehensive manner by undertaking additional conservation activities, and improving, maintaining and managing existing conservation activities; involves a five-year contract in which the farmer agrees to maintain existing conservation and to do more over the life of the contract. Documentation of farm conservation activities is used to determine eligibility and ranking. NRCS provides financial and technical assistance. Payments may range from about \$10 -\$40 per acre. 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<b>Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP)</b>	Offers financial assistance for implementing eligible conservation practices; may pay up to 75 % of the costs. Incentive payments may also be made to encourage a farmer to adopt land management practices, such as nutrient management, integrated pest management or wildlife habitat management. Contracts for practice implementation are from 1-10 years. <b>WI Working Lands Initiative (Farmland Preservation Program)</b>	The Wisconsin Working Lands Initiative provides eligible landowners with an opportunity to claim Farmland Preservation tax credits. These are income tax credits applied against tax liability and are available for the 2010 tax year and beyond. Tax credit amounts are: 1)\$5.00/ac for farmers with a Farmland Preservation Agreement (FPA) signed after July 1, 2009 and located in an Agricultural Enterprise Area (AEA) , 2) \$7.50/ac for farmers in an area zoned and certified for Farmland Preservation, and 3) \$10.00/ac for farmers in an area zoned and certified for Farmland Preservation, in an AEA, with a FPA signed after July 1, 2009. Landowners must be residents of Wisconsin and must meet other eligibility criteria to claim the credit, including compliance with state soil and water conservation standards.  At this time, only areas with designated Farmland Preservation are in Town of <b>Oconomowoc</b> , Town of <b>Ottawa</b> , and Town of <b>Eagle</b> (see Waukesha County Farmland Preservation Plan 2011 Update for maps).
<b>Soil and Water Resource Management Grant (SWRM)</b>	State grants to counties to provide landowner cost sharing to implement Land and Water Resource Management plans. Cost share assistance (up to 70%) to implement conservation practices (identified in ATCP 50). <b>Notice of Discharge Project Grant (NOD)</b>	Notice of Discharge (NOD) Project Grants are provided to local units of government (typically counties) by the Department of Natural Resources and the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection. The purpose of these grants is to provide cost sharing to farmers who are required to install agricultural best management practices to comply with NOD requirements.
