Ice Fishing

While ice fishing there are still Aquatic Invasive Species concerns.
vegetation can become tangled in equipment
and invasive fish can be caught.
It is important to follow these steps, no matter the season, to prevent
the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species on your lake!

INSPECT: sleds, trailers, and equipment REMOVE: all attached aquatic plants and animals DRAIN: all water/ice from vehicles and equipment NEVER MOVE: plants or live** fish from a waterbody

**Keep in mind that a fish is considered "dead" when it is out of water!

We can all do our part in slowing the spread of AIS where we fish!
