REGISTRATION

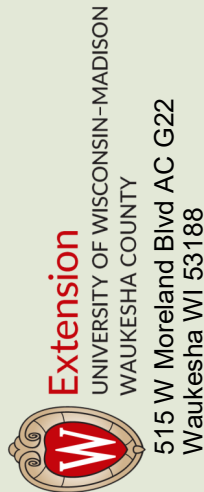
Attendance is limited to the first 50 paid participants. This event will be held rain or shine. No refunds will be given unless we cancel the event.

Diseases and Insects of the Urban Forest

PROGRAM

This one-day workshop will provide education on common and emerging tree disease and insect pests of importance in the urban forest. The day will include morning classroom instruction on insect and disease identification and management. It will be followed by afternoon diagnostic walks where attendees will learn practical skills for identifying and diagnosing tree diseases and insects in the field.

SPEAKERS

Brian Hudelson is the Director of Diagnostic Services in the Plant Disease Diagnostics Clinic at UW-Madison where he identifies plant diseases and provides clients with diagnoses and information on disease control.



PJ Liesch is an Extension entomologist and the expert on insect identification and biology at UW-Madison. Also known as the Wisconsin Bug Guy, PJ is the Director of the UW-Madison Department of Entomology Insect Diagnostic Lab.
