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Slesar called the meeting to order at 8:50 a.m. when a quorum was established.

Approval of Minutes from December 10, 2014

Motion: Manke moved, Bell second, to approve the minutes of December 10, 2014. Motion carried unanimously.

Update on WI Department of Justice JAG Crisis Intervention Team and Crisis Intervention Partners (CIT/CIP) Training Grant Award

Luczaj distributed and reviewed a handout titled *Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) & Crisis Intervention Partners (CIP) Training Grant Award Summary, March 2015*. Luczaj said the CJCC was awarded a \$50,000 grant from the WI DOJ for CIT and CIP trainings and stipends. CIP training will be held May 12-13, 2015 for up to 80 crisis services workers (correctional officers, probation agents, social workers, etc.) CIT training will be held May 18-22, 2015 for local law enforcement officers with 28 stipends. The grant provides \$1,300 stipends for participating officers to reimburse departments. Advanced CIT training will be held on June 16, 2015 for up to 25 officers who have completed a previous CIT training. NAMI Waukesha will facilitate the training.

Update on Committee Membership Changes

Slesar said the CJCC Executive Committee approved County Board Supervisor Christine Howard's membership to the committee. Slesar was recently appointed chair of the committee.

Presentation: 2014 CJCC Program Outcomes

Pretrial Jail Screening-Carpenter reviewed a handout titled *Waukesha County Pretrial Screening Intake Summary Report from January 1 to December 31, 2014* including statistics related to participant demographics, refusals, interviews, intakes with AODA issues, etc.

Pretrial Supervision-Carpenter reviewed a handout titled *WCS Waukesha Pretrial Status Report from January 1 to December 31, 2014* including statistics related to admissions, discharges, re-arrests and demographics.

Pretrial Intoxicated Driver Intervention-Carpenter reviewed a handout titled *WCS Pretrial Services-Waukesha OWI Program for January 1 to December 31, 2014* including statistics related to activities, referrals, recidivism, admissions, discharges, average length of stay, demographics, etc.

Discuss Potential Impact of State Budget Changes- Luczaj distributed and reviewed a handout outlining possible funding changes for the pretrial intoxicated driver intervention grant in the governor's proposed budget. The governor is proposing to transfer the administration of the grant program from the DOT to DHS and eliminate the related DOT appropriation of \$731,600.

Day Report Center- Carpenter reviewed a handout titled *Waukesha County Day Report Center Program, Wisconsin Community Services, Inc. for January 1 to December 31, 2014* including statistics related to assessments, referrals, levels of supervision, demographics, discharges, referrals, sanctions, average length of stay, jail days saved, etc.

In response to Slesar's question, Carpenter said in general, older DRC participants respond better to the program and younger participants are the most challenging to work with. Most of the DRC staff have been there more than five years and are great at connecting with younger participants. In response to Bell's question, Carpenter said the younger participants tend to have more mental health issues.

Offender Reentry Employment-Carpenter reviewed a handout titled *Waukesha County Wisconsin Community Services, Inc. Re-entry Employment Services Annual Report 2014* including statistics related to participant demographics, program accomplishments, job placement/retention, etc.

Update on NIC Technical Assistance Grant Award for Evidence-Based Decision Making (EBDM) Initiative & Next Steps

Luczaj said Wisconsin, along with three other states, applied for two NIC technical grants for EBDM Phase V initiatives in November. After several delays, NIC announced that three states would be awarded funding: Wisconsin, Virginia and Indiana. The State of Wisconsin will use its grant to work on initiatives with six counties: Waukesha, Rock, La Crosse, Marathon, Outagamie and Chippewa. In addition to monthly onsite technical assistance by NIC consultants from now until March 2016, NIC consultant Mimi Carter will be working with a Waukesha County policy team to map the county's entire criminal justice system. The county's policy team will attend a kickoff meeting in Green Lake on June 29-30, 2015. Once the state completes this planning phase, it can apply for an NIC implementation grant to effectuate planning efforts.

Update on Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) Enhancement Grant Application for Drug Court Program Discuss Future Program Sustainability Options

Luczaj provided a brief history of DTC funding. She indicated that the CJCC DTC currently receives funding from a BJA implementation grant. In June, the CJCC is eligible to apply for up to \$200K in BJA enhancement grant funding for the DTC for the period of October 1, 2015 to June 30, 2017. The CJCC Treatment Court Subcommittee recently met to brainstorm ideas, current needs and possible program enhancements in anticipation of the enhancement application, and came to the following conclusions:

- Need to maintain program capacity
- Need to maintain current drug testing levels
- Continued program evaluation by Temple University
- Continued need for supportive services such as transportation and program incentives
- Enhance program with peer specialists/recovery coaches
- Need for judicial training
- Need to hire a consultant to recommend strategies to transition HHS clinical services to same day access level of care

Motion: Carpenter moved, Bell second, to adjourn the meeting at 9:50 a.m. Motion carried unanimously.
