

EAGLE SPRING LAKE MANAGEMENT DISTRICT
REGULAR MEETING
May 19, 2015

Approved Minutes

Tom Day, Chairperson, called the meeting of the Eagle Spring Lake Management District (ESLMD) to order at 7:00p.m. Other Commissioners in attendance were Jim Pasterski, Matthew Thew, and Town of Eagle Representative Don Malek. Jack's Bay Project Volunteer/Resident Patrick Galagan was also present. John Mann (on vacation) and Dam Operator/Resident Peter Jensen (at conference) were excused. Waukesha County Representative Pam Meyer arrived at 7:03pm, and Nick Wambach arrived at 7:20pm (thinking meeting began at 7:30pm).

Approval of Minutes – D. Malek made a **Motion** to approve the minutes of the April 21, 2015 meeting with the following addition: First paragraph - 1st sentence - "(which was later than normal due to the Town of Eagle's Annual Meeting)."; second by M. Thew, motion carried.

Weed Harvesting/Collection/Chemical Treatment – On May 18, 2015, Jack's Bay and Pickeral Bay (not going around into Clark's Park area) were chemically treated with 2, 4-D to help eradicate the Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) that has reestablished itself. The EWM was to the surface in both areas. Pat Galagan stated that he has observed today (May 19, 2015) that the EWM treatment was starting to take effect in Jack's Bay.

T. Day stated that as of yesterday, he has not observed any other EWM growth in the lake (except for by Bolan's (and North) and small patch between Travers Island and parking lot for island); therefore, no harvesting operations have started.

Discussion/Possible Action for Suction Removal of EWM (Bolan's Beach Area) - The Board discussed the option of trying suction removal of EWM in the area of the lake that encompasses Bolan's and North along shoreline. Prior chemical treatments and mechanical harvesting have not produced positive results. D. Malek made a **Motion** to accept the bid from Eco Waterway Services and have them apply for the DNR permit and perform suction removal of the EWM (approximately 7000 sq. ft.), at a cost not to exceed \$2,330.00 (as per contract) in the Bolan's area (includes area north of Bolan's); second by J. Pasterski, motion carried.

Carp Initiative/Fishery Issues – T. Day reported a conservative count of 46 carp captured thus far, this year.

Believed due to windy/cold conditions, the Eagle Spring Pub carp out event that took place on May 17th was not very productive and attendance was less than expected. A \$150.00 prize for the longest single carp and a \$150.00 prize for the shortest single carp were awarded.

Weather Station and Website – There were no updates.

Wambold Dam/Millrace Issues - P. Jensen will give an update at the next meeting when he returns; progress has been made. In addition, we passed an inspection to make sure that the dam structures were locked.

Jack's Bay Restoration - The option of spot dredging in Jack's Bay may be considered.

CTH E No-Parking for Car/Trailers - T. Day reported that the Waukesha County Board of Supervisors approved the Waukesha County Engineer's recommendations that no parking be extended 200 feet further north to a point about 1,000 feet south of the CTH E/CTH LO intersection, and 1,100 feet further south to a point about 700 feet north of the CTH E/South Shore Drive intersection. The no parking signs have been put up by Waukesha County, with even more signs in between the existing signs.

Reverse Motor Ordinance Update - There are no new updates, the Town of Eagle is expected to further discuss the Reverse Motor Ordinance at their May 20, 2015 meeting.

New Business

Lake Patrol - T. Day reported that the patrol boat is ready and patrolling is expected to start May 23, 2015. The reverse motor sign in channel to Lulu is turned around and crooked; Pat Galagan

will straighten and turn it back to the correct direction.

Clean Boats/Clean Waters Program - The Clean Boats/Clean Waters staffing at the public launch started May 2, 2015 (opening fishing season weekend).

Other - As one of their options, the DNR is considering a canoe/kayak launch on South Shore. T. Day has talked with the DNR and advised them to expect opposition to the use of South Shore for a launch site if they choose to go that direction.

N. Wambach stated he has observed a beaver in the ski channel.

Financial Update and Payment of Bills – Motion made by J. Pasterski to approve and pay the bills; second by D. Malek, motion carried.

At 7:58 pm, J. Pasterski moved to adjourn, second by D. Malek, motion carried.
