

County Budget Process

One of the major responsibilities of the board is to adopt the annual county budget. The annual budget process is comprised of an operating budget and a capital budget with a five-year capital plan. Waukesha County has the lowest county property tax rate among counties without a sales tax. I am committed to maintaining the outstanding level of service while respecting the county taxpayers.

To hold the line on taxes, I will continue to look for ways to establish strategic partnerships and streamline operations to achieve ongoing cost savings.

The overriding goal of the Waukesha County budget is to keep the county's spending needs and the homeowner's ability to pay in balance. The County Board uses the following budget philosophy as a guide in its review:

- Incorporate citizen and stakeholder involvement.
- Establish links to strategic planning.
- Base decisions on measurable objectives.
- Maintain best budgeting practices for stable future budgets.
- Protect the County's Aaa/AAA bond ratings.

The county board begins the budget process in September with its review of the county's capital plan. The capital budget funds non-recurring expenditures that exceed \$100,000 for improvements in the county's infrastructure, such as roads, buildings and technology. The capital plan emphasizes long term planning, as opposed to reacting to crisis situations that would be more costly in the long run. The capital plan budget describes details of each capital project, estimates the project cost and priorities, identifies funding, provides a cost/benefit or return on investment analysis, considers alternatives, and estimates the impact on the operating budget. Capital projects are funded at a minimum with a 20% down payment.

In September the county board's executive committee reviews the capital plan budget and receives feedback from the standing committees. The board considers any amendments to the capital plan at executive committee or at the October board meeting where the plan is adopted.

Standing committees begin reviewing the operating budget throughout October. Below is the schedule for the standing committees budget review. Finance committee will also review the budget in its entirety. You can stay informed by monitoring [agendas posted online](#).
