ACCEPT HOMELAND SECURITY-URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE FY2010
PROGRAM FUNDING AND MODIFY THE EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS 2012
BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE GRANT REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES
FOR CITIZEN PREPAREDNESS ACTIVITIES

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security designated Waukesha County, along with the City of Milwaukee, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine and Washington Counties as an Urban Area eligible for grant funding to enhance the capabilities to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other all hazard events, and

WHEREAS, federal fiscal year 2010 Homeland Security-Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant funding is available to the Urban Area agencies, and

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee UASI included a funding request for the enhancement of citizen participation and preparedness for disaster or terrorism events through public education materials and training opportunities, and

WHEREAS, UASI will provide the funding in this grant to pay for contractual temporary assistance to coordinate training and outreach efforts; organize Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) classes; provide educational materials and equipment for class participants; continue to develop and maintain an informational website; and to provide financial support to coordinate program activities for Milwaukee and Waukesha Counties through the Southeast Wisconsin Citizens and Organizations Active in Disaster Council; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Homeland Security and the Wisconsin Office of Justice Assistance approved the investment justifications, allocated funding, authorized Waukesha County to submit a grant application and issued a grant award for this project.

THE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF WAUKESHA COUNTY ORDAINS that the Waukesha County Emergency Preparedness Department-Emergency Management Office is authorized to accept \$165,814 of Federal Homeland Security grant funding.




ACCEPT FISCAL NOTE

HOMELAND SECURITY-FY2010 PROGRAM FUNDING AND MODIFY THE
EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS 2010 BUDGET TO APPROPRIATE GRANT
REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES FOR MAINTENANCE AND ADMINISTRATION OF
MILWAUKEE URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE PARTICIPATION

This ordinance requests the 2012 Emergency Preparedness-Disaster Management program budget be modified to include \$165,814 of federal Homeland Security grant award funds to support the County's participation in the Milwaukee Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI). The purpose of the Initiative is to enhance area capabilities to respond to, recover from and mitigate against all-hazard emergency and disaster situations, including both natural and man-made disasters or emergencies.

According to the Emergency Management Coordinator, this grant is a pass through payment to the Southeast Wisconsin Citizens and Organizations Active in Disaster (SW COAD) organization to carry out the functions required in the grant on behalf of the two counties (Waukesha and Milwaukee). Waukesha County will serve as the fiscal agent for the grant period ending June 30, 2013.

This grant results in no additional direct tax levy impact in 2012.
