


**WITH YOUR
VETERANS' BENEFITS**

The Waukesha County Veterans' Services provides assistance to Waukesha County veterans and their families in obtaining federal and state veterans' entitlements.

We can help you discover the benefits to which you are entitled and assist you with the application process.

There is no fee for our services.

Wisconsin Dept. of Veterans Affairs

The State of Wisconsin provides a number of educational programs for state veterans that are in addition to any federal veterans educational benefits that may be available. Eligibility varies between programs, including state residency requirements.

Veterans Education (VetEd) Reimbursement Grant

The Veterans Education Reimbursement Grant (VetEd) provides tuition and fee reimbursement, based on the character and duration of active duty, to eligible veterans who do not hold a bachelor's degree. Other eligibility criteria apply, including family income limits. Veterans must apply within 60 days after the start of the academic term and earn at least a 2.0 GPA at a UW school, technical college, or approved institution of higher learning.

You may receive federal benefits and VetEd for the same semester (Limitations apply). Reimbursement is reduced to the extent that tuition and fees have been paid by other grants, scholarships and remissions, including the federal education benefits. VetEd cannot be used when also eligible for the Wisconsin G.I. Bill

Wisconsin G.I. Bill

The Wisconsin G.I. Bill provides a waiver "remission" of tuition for eligible veterans and their dependents for up to eight (8) fulltime semesters or 128 credits at any University of WI System or WI Technical College System institution.

Qualifying veterans who entered into military active duty from the State of Wisconsin or who have resided in the State of Wisconsin for five (5) consecutive years, prior to the start of the semester receive 100% remission.

If the veteran entered into military active duty from the State of Wisconsin then eligibility is also available to unremarried surviving spouse and children of a veteran who died in the line of duty, and to the spouse and children of a veteran with service-connected disabilities with a combined VA service-connected disability rating of 30% or greater. For qualifying children, the benefit is available from ages 18 through 25. The benefit recipient must reside in Wisconsin.

If the veteran is qualified under the 5 year residency rule the benefit is not available to the veterans' dependents.
